AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 80125 TO CHAPTER 80, DIVISION 4, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF I ESPITAT HÅYA IN THE SOUTH, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES; TO AMEND §§ 97103(a) AND 97102(e) OF CHAPTER 97. TITLE **10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO FUNDING** FOR I ESPITAT HAYA; TO ADD A NEW § 3809.1 OF CHAPTER 3, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES (DPHSS) TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACTUAL ARRANGEMENT WITH THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY FOR THE SHARED USE OF UNDERUTILIZED RESOURCES AND FACILITIES AT THE SOUTHERN REGIONAL COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER (SRCHC) IN INALAHAN ORDER TO (INARAJAN). IN FACILITATE ESTABLISHMENT OF I ESPITAT HAYA; AND TO REPEAL AND RE-ENACT § 3810 OF CHAPTER 3, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING DPHSS AND GMHA TO CONDUCT AN ANNUAL ASSESSMENT ON THE NEED FOR AND FEASIBILITY OF PROVIDING EXTENDED MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE NORTHERN **REGIONAL COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER (NRCHC)**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 3 accessibility to quality medical and health care services is essential for all of 4 For individuals and families residing in Guam's southern Guam's citizens. 5 villages and communities, in particular Malesso' (Merizo), Humåtak (Umatac), 6 Inalåhan (Inarajan), Malojloj (Malojloj), Hågat (Agat), Sånta Rita (Santa Rita), 7 Yo'ña (Yona), and Talo'fo'fo (Talofofo), immediate accessibility to such medical 8 facilities is lacking because of the distance between those villages and Guam's 9 only public hospital, the Guam Memorial Hospital, as well as other medical clinics 10 The residents of the south and their families are faced with and facilities. 11 particular hardships because of the distance and time required to travel to the 12 hospital and other medical facilities to receive medical care.

Also, for patients in the south who need outpatient hemodialysis treatments, the burden on them and their families is great because the patients must travel long distances several times a week to receive hemodialysis treatments, with each treatment lasting several hours. After treatments are completed, they must also travel long distances back to their homes.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the time has come for the government of
 Guam to establish *I Espitåt Håya* for the benefit of all residents of our southern
 villages.

21 Section 2. Short Title. This Act may be cited as "*I Espitât Håya* Act of 22 2015."

23 Section 3. *I Espitåt Håya* Established. A new § 80125 is hereby *added* to
24 Chapter 80 of Division 4, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

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"§ 80125. I Espitåt Håya (Southern Medical Center), Established.

26 (a) The Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) *shall*27 establish a medical clinic for the benefit of the southern residents of

1	Guam. The clinic shall be called "I Espitåt Håya." I Espitåt Håya –
2	or Southern Medical Center - shall serve as a satellite medical care
3	facility of the Guam Memorial Hospital, whose primary mission shall
4	be to make medical care services accessible in the southern region of
5	Guam. The nature and scope of such services shall be determined by
6	the GMHA Board, subject to the requirements set forth in Subsections
7	(b)-(c) of this section. Medical care at I Espitåt Håya shall be made
8	available to all patients who would otherwise be eligible for treatment
9	at the Guam Memorial Hospital.
10	(b) During its first year of operation and thereafter, GMHA
11	shall, at a minimum, make the following care and services available at
12	I Espitåt Håya:
13	(1) Extended medical services, which shall be made
14	available to the public seven (7) days a week, twenty-four (24)
15	hours a day;
16	(2) Basic laboratory services, including specimen
17	collection; and
18	(3) Pharmacy and pharmaceutical services;
19	(c) Not later than its second year of operation, GMH shall
20	also make the following care and services available at I Espitåt Håya,
21	in addition to those services identified in Subsection (b) of this
22	Section: Hemodialysis treatment on an outpatient basis, with a
23	minimum of two (2) bed stations.
24	(d) GMHA <i>shall</i> ensure that medical and healthcare services,
25	hemodialysis treatment, and other services provided at I Espitåt Håya
26	are maintained at a standard of care that meets all applicable

1 minimum criteria and requirements set forth by the Joint Commission 2 and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). 3 In order to maximize revenue collections (e) and 4 sustainability of I Espitåt Håya, GMHA shall: 5 (1)Ensure that I Espitåt Håya complies with Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) conditions of 6 7 participation and reimbursement for care, services, and other 8 items that are provided in connection with the treatment of 9 patients; and 10 (2)Implement a schedule of fees, established pursuant to the requirements of law, for care, services, medications, 11 supplies, and other items that are provided to patients at I12 13 Espitåt Håya. 14 (f)For purposes of the establishment of I Espitat Hava, 15 GMHA shall enter into contractual arrangements with the Department 16 of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) for the shared or collaborative use of underutilized resources and facilities at the 17 18 existing Southern Regional Community Health Center (SRCHC) located in the village of *Inalåhan* (Inarajan). 19 GMHA and DPHSS shall also work collaboratively with 20 (g)21 each other to establish arrangements for patient cross-referrals, 22 admission, discharge, and coordinated patient care, such as to maximize the medical services administered by DPHSS and GMHA 23 24 for their respective patient populations at the SRCHC and I Espitat 25 Håva. 26 (h) GMHA shall periodically evaluate, at least annually, facility and space requirements of I Espitåt Håya in order to 27

1 determine the need for additional facilities in order to meet operational objectives of I Espitåt Håya. 2 3 GMHA shall within thirty (30) days of enactment of this (i) 4 Act, establish a working group comprised of individuals having the 5 necessary expertise within GMHA, DPHSS, and other departments or 6 agencies of the government of Guam, and including the Chairperson 7 of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*'s legislative Committee on Health, to: 8 (1)Develop operational criteria for *I Espitåt Håya*: 9 (2)Identify adequate, available space and facilities for 10 the establishment of I Espitåt Håya, including facilitating and 11 maximizing the use of existing resources and facilities at the SRCHC in Inalåhan through any necessary contractual 12 13 arrangements; Develop a plan of action, inclusive of the financial 14 (3)15 requirements to commence the requisite processes necessary for 16 GMHA to establish I Espitåt Håya. Within ninety (90) days of the establishment of the 17 (i) 18 working group, the Administrator *shall* present a report addressing the items listed in Subsection (i) to the GMHA Board of Trustees. Such 19 20 based on the work, analysis, report shall be findings. 21 recommendations, and conclusions of the working group. The Board 22 shall approve or take other action on such report within sixty (60) days after submission by the Administrator. 23 24 (k) The Administrator shall, within 210 days of enactment of this Act, submit to I Liheslaturan Guåhan: (1) a copy of the report 25 26 submitted by the Administrator to the GMHA Board of Trustees pursuant to Subsection (j) of this Section, and (2) a detailed summary

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of the approval or other action taken by the GMHA Board on such report.

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Section 4. I Espitåt Håya, Funding.

4 (a) Legislative Findings. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that GMHA has 5 established and opened the Urgent Care Center mandated by Public Law 32-060, 6 within the premises of the Guam Memorial Hospital facility in Tamuning. 7 Therefore, a portion of the original funding source for the establishment of the 8 Urgent Care Center, as provided for in Public Law 32-060, can now be re-directed to the establishment of I Espitåt Håya. The funding source identified in Public 9 Law 32-060, Section 4 (codified at 10 GCA, Chapter 97), is the GMHA Healthcare 10 11 Trust and Development fund. The Urgent Care Facility at the hospital in 12 Tamuning has begun intake of patients and therefore *must* be able to rely more and 13 more on patient revenues as a sustainable source of income, and less on the GMHA 14 Healthcare Trust and Development Fund.

10 GCA, Chapter 97, § 97103(a) is hereby amended to read as 15 **(b)** 16 follows:

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"§ 97103. Allocations and Use of Funds; Authorized.

18 (a) Up to sixty thirty percent, of the funds in the GMHA 19 Healthcare Trust and Development Fund, shall be allocated to the 20 Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the purpose of subsidizing the 21 establishment and operation, in whole or in part, including as seed or 22 start-up money, of an Urgent Healthcare Center within the Guam 23 Memorial Hospital Authority facility and grounds. Up to thirty 24 percent, of the funds in the GMHA Healthcare Trust and Development fund, shall be allocated to the Guam Memorial Hospital 25 26 Authority for the purpose of subsidizing the establishment and 27 operation, in whole or in part, including as seed or start-up money, of

2		pursuant to this Article <i>shall</i> be annually allocated <u>according to the</u>

		respective percentages established in this Subsection (a) and is are
4		hereby appropriated, and <i>shall</i> continue to be deemed appropriated,
5		annually, to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the sole and
6		specific purpose of subsidizing the establishment and operation, in
7		whole or in part, including as seed or start-up money, of (1) an
8		Urgent Healthcare Medical Center within the Guam Memorial
9		Hospital Authority facility and grounds and (2) I Espitat Haya."
10	(c)	10 GCA, Chapter 97, § 97102(e) is hereby amended to read as
11	follows:	
12		"(e) The Department of Administration shall disperse funds in a
13		manner compliant with <u>§ 97103</u> § 97105 of this Chapter."
14	Secti	on 5. A new § 3809.1 is added to Chapter 3, Title 10, Guam Code
15	Annotated,	to read as follows:
16		"§ 3809.1. Use of the SRCHC.
17		The Department of Public Health and Social Service shall enter
18		into a contractual arrangement with the Guam Memorial Hospital
19		Authority (GMHA) for the shared or collaborative use of
20		underutilized resources and facilities at the Southern Regional
21		Community Health Center (SRCHC), such that GMHA may establish
22		and operate I Espitåt Håya pursuant to 10 GCA § 80125. One
23		primary mission of I Espitåt Håya shall be to make medical care
24		services more accessible in the southern region of Guam.
25	Secti	on 6. 10 GCA, Chapter 3, § 3810, is <i>repealed</i> and <i>re-enacted</i> to read as
26	follows:	
27		"§ 3810. Urgent Care ServiceExtended Medical Services.

1	The Director of Public Health and Social Services (Director)
2	and the Administrator of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority
3	(Administrator) shall jointly evaluate, at least annually, the need for,
4	and the feasibility of, providing extended medical services for the
5	northern region of Guam, including the feasibility of utilizing
6	facilities at the Northern Regional Community Health Center
7	(NRCHC) for such services. The Director and the Administrator shall
8	jointly submit to I Maga'lahen Guåhan and I Liheslaturan Guåhan an
9	annual report on their periodic assessment and findings no later than
10	180 days prior to the end of each fiscal year beginning with fiscal year
11	2016. The Community Health Center shall provide urgent care
12	service based on the unavailability of such service in the community
13	and shall enter into a contractual agreement with the Guam Memorial
14	Hospital Authority or other health care providers to provide such
15	service. The urgent care service must be adequate to meet the
16	following medical care:
17	(a) Conditions that are non-emergency in nature.
18	(Emergency conditions are those illnesses that may result in the loss
19	of life or limb if not treated immediately.);
20	(b) Services are competent to manage and treat
21	patients of all ages;
22	(c) The facility shall have at least basic pharmacy,
23	radiology, laboratory and patient transport to move cases that require
24	a higher level of patient care management;
25	(d) The facility shall be certifiable by either the Joint
26	Commission of Accreditation of Health Organizations or Health Care
27	Financing Administration, or equivalent certifying health care

****	organization acceptable by the Health Planning Council of the
2	Division of Health Planning of DISID; and
3	(e) The urgent care service shall consider initially
4	opening at least five (5) days a week between the hours of 6:00 p.m.
5	to 11:00 p.m. and extend the hours and/or days as the demand arises
6	and availability of resources. The Director shall evaluate at least
7	annually the service hours and/or days and make necessary adjustment
8	based on the community needs and availability of resources in
9	consultation with the Council."
10	Section 7. Enactment. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
