AN ACT TO AMEND § 77119 TO CHAPTER 77, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; RELATIVE TO THE ASSIGNMENT OF POLICE OFFICERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the 2 3 Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority ("GHURA") owns and manages four (4) Asset Management Properties ("AMP") each consisting 4 of numerous public housing units, throughout Guam which are occupied 5 by GHURA tenants. I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that crime and 6 violence have significantly increased during the past several years at the 7 AMPs affecting the safety and security of the residents. Many of the 8 residents living in the AMPs have expressed a desire and need for the 9 development and establishment of on-site law enforcement to provide 10 vital police and security services for the protection and benefit of the 11 residents and their families. 12

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that government resources are scarce and there is a lack of adequate funding to pay for police and security services within GHURA's budget in order to address these critical and necessary services and therefore a viable option involves the

establishment of a cooperative relationship between GHURA and the Guam Police Department through a Housing Security Services Program.

Section 2. § 77119, Chapter 77, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§ 77119. Assignment of Police Officers. The Chief of Police, or his designee, may assign police officers consistent with the needs of the Department to the villages so as to be the most efficient in carrying out the purposes of the Department to preserve the peace, to enforce the law and to prevent and detect crime. The Chief of Police may assign those hired as limited term police officers to serve as a school resource officer, who at the minimum will be responsible for addressing drugs and violence in the schools, the investigation of criminal activity involving juveniles, and other duties as agreed upon by the parties in a Memorandum of Understanding and whose employment shall be on a school-year basis. Further the Chief of Police or his designee, may provide opportunity to officers and/or civilian volunteer police reserve officers to reside in the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority Asset Management Properties consistent with a Memorandum of Understanding under the Housing Security Service Program between the Department and the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority.
