AN ACT TO AMEND \$74108 OF CHAPTER 74, TITLE Many C. Molles
11 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO Dennis 6. Podrymens
INCREASING THE CIVIL PENALTIES FOR SCRAP
METAL BUSINESSES WHO FAIL TO PROPERLY
FOLLOW REPORTING REQUIREMENTS AS PER
GUAM LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that

Public Law 29-70 greatly increased the reporting requirements for scrap metal

businesses in an effort to curb the rash of copper wire and other non-ferrous metals

thefts occurring in our community. However, I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that

6 scrap metal dealers have failed to properly maintain records of non-ferrous metal

transactions. More stringent civil penalties are required to detract scrap metal

8 businesses from failing to report all non-ferrous metal property purchases as required

9 by Guam law.

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Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to amend §74108 of Chapter

11 74, Title 11 Guam Code Annotated to increase the civil penalties for scrap metal

businesses who fail to comply with reporting requirements.

13 Section 2. §74108 of Chapter 74, Title 11 Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended

14 to read:

1 "§ 74108. Civil Penalties.

- 2 (a) Each violation of the requirements of this Chapter shall be punishable, 3 upon conviction, by a fine of not more less than One Thousand Dollars 4 (\$1,000.00) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) and the permanent 5 revocation of a scrap metal business' business license.
  - (b) Within two (2) years of being convicted of a violation of any of the requirements of this Chapter, each subsequent violation shall be punishable, upon conviction, by a fine of not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00)."
  - **Section 3. Deposit of Fines.** Subsection (a) of § 77134 of Chapter 77, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated is *amended* to read:
  - "(a) The Chief of Police may prescribe in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law fees to be charged and collected by the Department that are directly related to the need of the agency to recover administrative costs in servicing the public. These fees and fines imposed under § 74108 of Chapter 74, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated shall be deposited in a special account known as the 'Police Services Fund,' established separate and apart from the General Fund to be administered by the Director of Administration for the benefit of the Guam Police Department. The Guam Legislature shall make appropriations from the 'Police Services Fund' for the purpose of funding the general operational needs of the Guam Police Department on a fiscal year basis. These funds, once appropriated to the Department, are not subject to the transfer authority of the Governor."
  - Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective immediately upon enactment.
  - **Section 5. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall

- 1 not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect
- 2 without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 3 Law are severable.
