AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER 45 OF ARTICLE 1 PART 2 OF TITLE 10 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND REENACT IT AS CHAPTER 2 OF DIVISION 1 OF TITLE 12 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO PROVIDE FOR AN AUTONOMOUS GUAM ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AUTHORITY AND TO INCLUDE THE GUAM ENERGY DIVISION WITHIN THE AUTHORITY, REPLACING THE GUAM ENERGY OFFICE, AND TO AMEND § 4105 (A) AND (B) OF CHAPTER 4 TITLE 4 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

§ 2100. Statement of Policy and Purpose. It is hereby declared to be the public policy of Guam that a high quality environment be maintained at all times to guarantee an enjoyable and healthy life for all people at present and in the future, and that environmental degradation of the quality of land, water and air by any pollutants, including all physical, chemical, biological and other identified agents, should not be allowed. To these ends, it is the purpose of this Article to provide a united, integrated and comprehensive islandwide program of environmental protection and to provide a framework to fulfill that task.

In addition to the protection of human enjoyment and health in the context of environmental concerns, it is the purpose of this Authority, through its Division of Energy, to assist in the reduction of Guam's dependence on energy that is derived from non-renewable sources, and to be the designated local entity to apply and receive

3	§ 2101. Short Title. This Chapter shall be known as the Guam
4	Environmental Protection Authority Act.
5	§ 2102. Definitions. Except as provided in or where otherwise
6	clearly indicated by the content, the following definitions shall apply
7	throughout this Chapter:

16	§ 2103. Continuation of Existence. The Guam Environmental
17	Protection Agency created by Public Law No. 11-191, is continued in
18	existence as a public corporation to be known as the Guam
19	Environmental Protection Authority (GEPA).
20	§ 2104. Management and Administration.

(a) Management. The management of the Authority shall be vested in a Board of Directors consisting of nine (9) members to be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature. Members of the Board shall serve for a period of three (3) years each, except that any member appointed to fill a vacancy prior to the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was appointed, shall be appointed for the remainder of such term. The terms shall stagger so that three (3) members shall be appointed by the Governor each year. The majority of the members of the Board shall not be employees of the government of Guam. A Chairperson and Vice Chairperson shall be elected from among the members. The Board shall adopt personnel rules pursuant to Title 4 Guam Code Annotated §\$4105 and 4106.

Members of the Board shall be compensated at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per meeting attended subject to a maximum of twenty (20) meetings per member per year.

(b) Administrator. The Board shall appoint an Administrator to administer matters of the Authority under the supervision of the Board. The Administrator shall not be a member of the Board and shall not have a right to vote. The Administrator shall be given the necessary authority and be held responsible for the administration of

the Authority in all of its activities subject only to such policies as may be adopted and such orders as may be issued by the Board. The Administrator will serve at the pleasure of the Board.

- (c) Deputy Administrator for Energy. The Board shall appoint a Deputy Administrator who shall not be a member of the Board and shall not have a right to vote. The Deputy Administrator shall administer the Authority's Division of Energy and all programs relative to the U.S. Department of Energy and its offices. The Deputy Administrator shall also perform such functions as the Administrator desires during the absence of the Administrator or in the event of a vacancy in the Office of the Administrator until such time that another Administrator is appointed. The Deputy Administrator will serve at the pleasure of the Board.
- (d) Secretary of the Board. The Secretary of the Board shall be appointed by the Administrator and confirmed by the Board. The Secretary shall be responsible for keeping records of meetings and actions of the Board. The Secretary of the Board will serve at the pleasure of the Board.
- (e) Qualifications, Duties, Tenure, and Compensation. The Board shall establish the qualifications, duties, tenure and compensation of the Administrator, Deputy Administrator for

Energy, and Secretary, in accordance with the personnel laws of Guam. The Civil Service Commission shall establish the qualifications, duties, compensation and benefits of other personnel within the Authority and its Division, in accordance with the personnel laws of Guam.

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§ 2105. Powers and Duties. The GEPA shall be responsible for the administration and the carrying out the mission of GEPA in enforcing laws and programs relative to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and laws and programs designed by local law; for administration and carrying out of the mission of the Guam Energy Division in relation to programs relative to the U.S. Department of Energy and its offices, and laws and programs designated by local law, and for the implementation of the following related laws all contained in Title 10 Guam Code Annotated Part 2: the Water Resources Conservation Act, Chapter 46; the Water Pollution Control Act, Chapter 47; Toilet Facilities and sewage Disposal Act, Chapter 48; the Air Pollution Control Act, Chapter 49; the Guam Pesticides Act, Chapter 50; Solid Waste Management and Litter Control, 51; Water and Wastewater Operator's Mandatory Chapter Certification Act, Chapter 52; Safe Drinking Water Act, Chapter 53; Guam Lead Ban Act, Chapter 53a; Environmental Pollution Control,

Chapter 54; and Guam Oil Spill Responders Act, Chapter 54a; for administering any other program designed by law or executive order to be administered by GEPA or the Guam Energy Division.

(a) The Authority *may*:

- (1) Enter into contracts for personnel and services. It has the power to sue and be sued in its own name and to hire or contract for an attorney.
- (2) Employ agents, enter into contracts, leases, concession agreements and execute all instruments necessary or convenient to assist the mission of the Authority and its employees, all of which may be accomplished without regard to the portion of the Personnel Laws relative to compensation, adopt a seal and sue or be sued in its own corporate name. Litigation shall be undertaken by the Attorney General of Guam, or by the agency attorney as designated by the Attorney General of Guam.
- (3) Impose, prescribe, revise policies and collect fees assessed in the provision of services pursuant to this statute.
- (4) Issue permits consistent with its federal and local mandates.

(5) Receive and disburse Federal and local funds, submit project grant applications, program of projects to Federal agencies, and enter into formal agreements concerning projects with Federal agencies.

- (6) Adopt such rules and regulations, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, as may be necessary for the exercise of powers and performance of the duties conferred or imposed upon the Authority or the Board.
- (7) Acquire personal and real property through negotiation, grant, gift, lease, or permit in accordance with the provisions and subject to the limitations of laws of Guam, including Chapter 5, Title 5, GCA, and hold and use any real and personal property necessary, convenient or useful for the carrying out of any of its powers pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, and to dispose of the same.

§ 2106. Guam Energy Division. There is hereby created, within GEPA, the Guam Energy Division. The Guam Energy Division is responsible for the administration of all Guam's energy-related federal programs and is designated as the single state agency for applying for, receiving, and administering or determining the administering entity of all federal energy related grants from the

United States Department of Energy or subsequent entity. The Guam Energy Division of GEPA is the successor entity to the Guam Energy Office created by Public Law No. 12-100, amended by Public Law No. 12-150, and extended through Executive Order Nos. 75-13, 83-04, and combined with GEPA through Executive Order No. 2007-14.

§ 2107. Fiscal Authority.

- (a) There is hereby established a fund to be known as the Guam Environmental Protection Authority Fund which shall be maintained by the Board separate and apart from other funds of the government of Guam. Independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith.
- **(b)** All moneys received by the Authority however derived, including Federal sources, fees, fines, and appropriations, shall be deposited in the Guam Environmental Protection Authority Fund in eligible banks as defined in § 21112, Chapter 21 of Title 5 Guam Code Annotated.
- **(c)** All expenditures of the Authority shall be made from the Guam Environmental Protection Authority Fund.

§ 2108. Chief Financial Officer.

The Board shall appoint a chief financial officer who shall serve at its pleasure. The chief financial officer shall be a Certified Public Accountant. The Board shall fix the chief financial officer's compensation. The chief financial officer shall have full charge and control of the Guam Environmental Protection Authority Fund, and to the fiscal, business and accounting operations of the Authority, subject to the supervision of the Board.

§ 2109. Transition. All personnel, assets, equipment, funds, property, records and programs under the Guam Energy Office that were previously transferred to the administration of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency through Executive Order No. 2007-14 are permanently transferred to the Guam Environmental Protection Authority."

Section 2. Transition to autonomous Guam Environmental Protection Authority. The current members of the Board of GEPA shall continue in their current terms of office. Upon expiration of their current terms, the vacancies shall be filled as provided in this legislation. The current Administrator, Deputy Administrator, and Secretary of the GEPA and the Guam Energy Office, shall continue in their current terms of employment under this legislation, unless replaced by the Board. The classified employees of GEPA shall continue in their current positions pursuant to GEPA's personnel rules and regulations.

Section 3. § 4105 (a) and (b) of Chapter 4 Title 4 Guam Code Annotated are hereby *amended* to read:

"§ 4105. Departmental Rules.

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(a) Rules subject to criteria established by this Chapter governing the selection, promotion, performance, evaluation, demotion, suspension and other disciplinary action of classified employees shall be adopted by the Board of Directors of the Guam Environmental Protection Authority; the Board of Directors of the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam; the Board of Directors of the Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority; the Board of Directors of the Guam Housing Corporation; the Board of Commissioners of the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority; the Guam Judicial Council; the Board of Directors of the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port; the Guam Education Policy Board; the Board of Regents of the University of Guam; the Guam Community College Board of Trustees; the Board of Trustees of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority; the Board of Directors of the Guam Visitors Bureau; and the Consolidated Commission on Utilities on behalf of the Guam Waterworks Authority and the Guam Power Authority, with respect to personnel within their respective Branches, matters agencies, public

corporations or departments, and by the Director of Administration as to all other Executive Branch employment.

(b) Such rules shall, to the extent practicable, provide standard conditions for entry into and the other matters concerning the government service. The personnel rules adopted for the Guam Environmental Protection Authority, the Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation, the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, the University of Guam, the Guam Community College, the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam, the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port, the Guam Public School System, the Hospital by Authority, Guam Memorial the Director Administration and by the Consolidated Commission on Utilities shall require that all their classified employee appeals, except academic personnel of the Guam Community College and the University of Guam in conformance with Title 4 GCA § 4403(h), be heard by the Civil Service Commission ('Commission')."

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
