Relative to commending and congratulating Dr. Daisaku Ikeda and Mrs. Kaneko Ikeda on their tireless efforts and dedication in promoting world peace and to congratulating the world-wide members of Soka Gakkai International (SGI), SGI-USA, Guam, on their 34th Anniversary of the founding of SGI.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, in response to the needs of an increasingly global community of Soka Gakkai members, the Soka Gakkai International (SGI) was formed in Guam on January 26, 1975, and on the same day, thirty-four (34) years ago, one hundred fifty-eight (158) delegates from fifty-one (51) countries met for the first World Peace Conference, nominating Dr. Daisaku Ikeda, then president of Soka Gakkai, to head the new Soka Gakkai International; and WHEREAS, Guam was selected as the venue to conduct the first World

WHEREAS, Guam was selected as the venue to conduct the first World Peace Conference, given that the *Chamorro* people suffered so terribly from the ravages of war; and

WHEREAS, from that auspicious occasion, the delegates founded Soka Gakkai International (SGI), and began the worldwide grassroots activities of peace, education and culture, based on the humanistic outlook of Nichiren Buddhism; and

WHEREAS, today, SGI is a worldwide network with eighty-two (82) constituent organizations and more than twelve million (12,000,000) members in one hundred ninety-two (192) countries and territories, sharing a common vision of global peace and prosperity and for twenty-nine (29) years, has been accredited as a Non-governmental Organization (NGO) by the United Nations (UN); and

WHEREAS, as a NGO of the United Nations, SGI has worked tirelessly with other UN entities in promoting harmony and coexistence between nations in the fields of humanitarian relief and public education, with a focus on peace, environmental protection and human rights; and

WHEREAS, throughout the 1980s and 1990s, Dr. Ikeda's peace proposals addressed such themes as the power of dialogue, the adoption of a Universal Declaration Renouncing War, and the need for mutual respect in cultural exchange; and he further cited the important role of the United Nations in maintaining global security, while challenging it to become more representative of the people rather than just nation states; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Ikeda, who has attained the status of a world-renowned Buddhist scholar and peace activist, has made it his personal mission to engage in more than one thousand five hundred (1,500) dialogues for peace with noted world leaders such as Dr. Arnold Toynbee; Nobel Laureate and former President of South Africa Nelson Mandela; former U.S. Secretary of State Henry Kissinger; former Soviet Union President Mikhail Gorbachev; civil rights leader Rosa Parks; and Dr. Elise Boulding; and

WHEREAS, for his humanitarian endeavors in a range of fields, Dr. Ikeda has been a recipient of numerous honorary doctorates and awards including the United Nation Peace Award, the Rosa Parks Humanitarian Award, the National Order of the Southern Cross of the Republic of Brazil, the United States Congressional Award, the Honorary Cross of Science and the

- 1 Arts from the Austrian Ministry of Education, Medal of the Grand Officer of
- 2 Arts and Letters from the French Ministry of Culture, the Grand Officer
- 3 award from the President of the Italian Republic and the World Poet
- 4 Laureateship from the World Poetry Society, the Order of Friendship from
- 5 Russia, and the Honorary Doctorate from the University of Guam; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Dr. Ikeda has encouraged the members of SGI to devote
- 7 their lives to planting seeds of peace throughout the world, rather than
- 8 seeking to bring the flowers of their own lives to bloom; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the members of the SGI resolve to contribute to the
- 10 prosperity of their respective societies and countries, while respecting
- 11 individual cultures, customs and laws; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Dr. Daisaku Ikeda and Mrs. Kaneko Ikeda have received
- 13 worldwide recognition for fulfilling the dreams of Mr. Tsunesaburo
- 14 Makiguchi and Mr. Josei Toda, with the establishment of the Soka Education
- 15 system, which includes elementary to university-level institutions in Japan,
- 16 and Soka University of America located in Aliso Viejo, California, the
- 17 establishment of the Min-On Concert Association, and the creation of the
- 18 Tokyo Fuji Art Museum; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the members of SGI-USA, Guam, have pursued activities to
- advance the cause of peace in dedication to the commitment by Dr. Ikeda; and
- WHEREAS, on January 2000, SGI-USA, Guam, commemorated the 25th
- 22 anniversary of the founding of SGI, by co-sponsoring with the University of

- 1 Guam, Soka University of America and SGI-USA, the first Pacific Islands New
- 2 Millennium Peace Conference; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the conference brought together government leaders and
- 4 high chiefs from many of the Pacific Islands to share their memories of the
- 5 Pacific War and resolve to never again allow such violence; and
- 6 WHEREAS, on January 2005, SGI-USA, Guam, commemorated the 30th
- 7 Anniversary of the founding of SGI, by hosting numerous commemorative
- 8 events in the name of peace, including the opening of two (2) traveling
- 9 exhibitions, "Building a Culture of Peace for the Children of the World" and
- 10 Morehouse College's "Gandhi, King, Ikeda: A Legacy of Building Peace";
- 11 these traveling exhibits were displayed at the office of the Governor of Guam,
- 12 the University of Guam and the Guam Community College; and
- 13 WHEREAS, SGI-USA, Guam hosted the Second Pacific Islands New
- 14 Millennium Peace Conference for educators focusing on "Humanistic
- 15 Education: Fostering a Culture of Peace" and sponsored a cultural festival
- 16 celebrating the diverse culture of mankind; and
- 17 WHEREAS, on January 2007, SGI-USA, on its 32nd Anniversary of the
- 18 founding of SGI-USA, Guam, another milestone was realized with the grand
- 19 opening of its new Activity Center, an occasion that members of SGI-USA,
- 20 Guam, have been working hard for years in order to accommodate their
- 21 members and Buddhist activities; and

1 WHEREAS, on January 26, 2009, SGI-USA, Guam, will commemorate

2 its 34th Anniversary by advancing the initiative that it is possible to transform

the culture of violence into a culture of a peace; and

WHEREAS, during its 34th Anniversary, SGI-USA, Guam. will be hosting various events throughout Guam, including an exhibit at the Agana Shopping Center offering a variety of speakers and performing artists promoting the theme "From a Culture of Violence to a Culture of Peace: Transforming the Human Spirit"; and

WHEREAS, SGI-USA, Guam, believes that the creation of lasting peace and the elimination of violence, rather than the promotion of high level social reform, ultimately lies upon the ability of each individual in earth to inherently embrace the spirit of peace in their hearts; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Daisaku Ikeda and Mrs. Kaneko Ikeda have dedicated more than sixty (60) years of their lives to the promotion of peace, culture, and education through their committed efforts as leaders of SGI and continues to serve as inspiring examples of how one person's committed efforts can transform the lives of millions of people around the world including those of us here on Guam; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend the world-wide members of SGI on it's tireless efforts and dedication in promoting world peace, which is ever more relevant in the age of terror and war, and

- 1 congratulates SGI-USA, Guam, on the 34th Anniversary of the founding of
- 2 SGI; and be it further
- 3 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the
- 4 Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be
- 5 thereafter transmitted to President Daisaku Ikeda and Mrs. Kaneko Ikeda of
- 6 Soka Gakkai International (SGI); to SGI-USA, Los Angeles, California; to SGI-
- 7 USA, Guam; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, I Maga'lahen Guåhan.
