Relative to encouraging the people of Guam to support activities that raise awareness and encourage prevention of substance abuse on the occasion of "Red Ribbon Campaign Week" from October 23 to 31, 2009.

- BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I
- 2 MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
- 3 WHEREAS, alcohol and drug abuse on our Island and across the Nation
- 4 have reached epidemic proportions. As an Island community, we value the

- 1 health and safety of all our citizens, especially Guam's youth. Today, we face
- 2 many challenges as we try to protect our people from the ongoing battle of
- 3 substance abuse; and
- 4 WHEREAS, substance abuse, either through the use of drugs or alcohol,
- 5 not only has a negative effect on individuals, families, businesses and schools,
- 6 but is a contributing factor in the three (3) leading causes of death among
- 7 adolescents, which are accidents, homicides and suicide; and
- 8 WHEREAS, recognizing the seriousness of this threat, concerned
- 9 individuals initiated the first "Red Ribbon Campaign" in 1986. This
- 10 grassroots effort emphasized education and the importance of instructing
- 11 children and teenagers about the dangers of drug and alcohol use. Since then,
- 12 significant progress has been made in reducing drug and alcohol abuse
- 13 among Guam's young adults; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Guam's participation in this national effort was started by
- 15 the Dededo Drug-Free Organization (now known as Youth For Youth LIVE!
- 16 Guam) in 1988; and
- 17 WHEREAS, with this year's theme "Drug-Free is the Key", a wide
- 18 variety of activities have been planned to include a poster contest open to all
- 19 students on Guam and various drug awareness presentations conducted by
- 20 coalition members at our schools. These events are made possible by the Red
- 21 Ribbon Campaign Committee comprised of U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency,
- 22 the Guam National Guard Counter Drug Program, the Guam Chamber of
- 23 Commerce, the Judiciary of Guam-Juvenile Drug Court, the U.S. Attorney's

Office, the Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency, the District Court of 1 2 Guam and the U.S. Probation Office, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Prevention & Training 3 Branch & Drug & Alcohol- New Beginnings Program, Youth for Youth Live! 4 5 Guam, Sanctuary Incorporated of Guam, Island Girl Power, Big Brothers Big 6 Sisters of Guam, WestCare, the Department of Youth Affairs, the Office of the Governor, the Mayors Council of Guam, the Guam Fire Department, Naval 7 Base Guam, the Department of Defense Educational Activities, the Guam 8 Department of Education, various government of Guam agencies. This 9 10 awareness effort, aimed towards Guam's community, is a chance to further 11 our mission's desire for a drug-free community; and WHEREAS, it is the goal of this "Red Ribbon Campaign" to involve 12 13 families, schools, business, churches, law enforcement agencies and service 14 organizations in all aspects of this campaign, and to establish an atmosphere 15 that supports awareness, education and on-going initiatives to prevent illegal

WHEREAS, on the occasion of "Red Ribbon Campaign Week," I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan encourages all residents to consider ways to participate in this important effort. As we build upon the successes of the past, we strengthen the Guam of tomorrow, and with strong resolve and creative leadership, protect our community from the preventable dangers of alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse; now, therefore, be it
