WHEREAS, in July 1942, one (1) month after finishing college,
Captain O'Brien enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and eventually
reached the rank of Captain. He served in a line company with the 3rd
Marine Division on Bougainville, and then as a Combat Correspondent on
Guam and Iwo Jima; and

9 WHEREAS, shortly after World War II, Captain O'Brien returned to
10 journalism as a Washington correspondent, covering the House and Senate
11 for newspapers in New Jersey; and

12 WHEREAS, Captain O'Brien is now retired from his last job as 13 Director of Media Affairs at Johns Hopkins' Applied Physics Laboratory, 14 the principal Navy research and development lab for missiles, undersea 15 warfare, space and earth satellites; and

16 WHEREAS, Captain O'Brien has authored two (2) publications: 17 "Liberation," which features Marines in the recapture of Guam, and which 18 was published by the Marine Corps Historical Center; and "Two Score and 19 Ten," a compilation of hundreds of anecdotes of war with the 3rd Marine 20 Division, and which includes photos, memoirs, battle reports, citations and 21 tributes; now, therefore, be it
