3	WHEREAS, on August 26, 1969, Lieutenant Commander Steven A. Jones
4	was born in Norfolk, Virginia to E.W. Jones, Jr. and LaDonna Jones; and
5	WHEREAS, Lieutenant Commander Steven A. Jones, through the
6	sacrosanct act of matrimony, was wed to Krystal Anderson and blessed
7	with three daughters and two sons by the name of Kathleen, Kevin, Samantha, Carol
8	and Christopher; and
9	WHEREAS, in 1986 Lieutenant Commander Steven A. Jones joined the
10	Naval Reserves and served as an Operations Specialist while earning a Bachelor of
11	Science in Chemical Engineering from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State
12	University in 1992; and

13	WHEREAS, Ensign Jones' first assignment was with Naval Mobile
14	Construction Battalion TWENTY-THREE as Equipment Officer; and
15	WHEREAS, in 1997 he transferred to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion
16	TWENTY-ONE as Embarkation Officer. He mobilized an Air Detachment to Puerto
17	Rico and the battalion to Camp LeJeune; and
18	WHEREAS, after NMCB 21 he accepted an Active Duty for Special Work
19	assignment at NAVFACENGCOM in support of the Navy's effort to recycle
20	Vietnam-era Napalm; and
21	WHEREAS, LTJG Jones voluntarily recalled to active duty in December of
22	1998, attended Civil Engineer Basic Indoctrination from January to April 1999, with a
23	follow-on assignment to Naval Air Station Kingsville as Assistant Public Works
24	Officer from May 1999 to May 2001; and
25	WHEREAS, LT Jones then served as Assistant Resident Officer in Charge of
26	Construction at OICC Guam from June 2001 to July 2003, responsible for over \$200
27	million on 15 Military Construction Projects for the Navy and the Air Force; and
28	WHEREAS, LT Jones was then assigned to Naval Mobile Construction
29	Battalion ONE from August 2003 to July 2005 where he served as the Training and
30	Armory Officer, Headquarters Company Commander, Communications and SORTs
31	Officer, and the Bravo Company Commander; and
32	WHEREAS, LT Jones was then assigned to the ROICC office
33	at Kings Bay where he oversaw \$70M of construction and services. During his time

34	at Kings Bay he was transferred to the Public Works Department as the Production
35	Officer were he was responsible for compiling the first ever Navy Working Capital
36	Fund (NWCF) budget for Kings Bay, managing the utility systems and the Energy
37	Program where he saved over \$200K; and
38	WHEREAS, LT Jones left active duty and affiliated, again, with the Reserve
39	Component. He was assigned to NMCB 24 as the FEX Preparation Officer, an
40	enabled three Officers to become Seabee Combat Warfare Qualified. In his civilian
41	capacity, he worked as a Civilian Marine for the Marine Corps Logistics Base
42	in Albany, GA as the Engineering Section Head for the Public Works Department;

44	WHEREAS, LCDR Jones was assigned to the 3rd Naval Construction
45	Regiment as the Administration Officer; and
46	WHEREAS, he left this assignment early when his civilian career enabled
47	him to take a position with the Naval Facilities Engineering Command
48	Marinas, Guam as the Deputy Operations Officer; and
49	WHEREAS, LCDR Jones' final assignment was with Commander, Naval
50	Engineering Forces Korea; and
51	WHEREAS, LCDR Jones is a Seabee Combat Warfare Qualified Officer
52	whose personal decorations include the Navy Commendation Medal, Navy
53	Achievement Medal with four gold stars, Humanitarian Service Medal with bronze
54	star, Naval Reserve Meritorious Service Medal with a bronze star, Armed Forces

55	Reserve Medal with hourglass, Expert Rifleman Medal, and Sharpshooter Pistol Shot
