**Relative to honoring, commending, and congratulating  
Captain Noel Molina Enriquez on the occasion of his  
retirement from the United States Navy after thirty (30)  
years of dedicated military service.**

1        **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I***  
2        ***MINA'TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÁHAN:***  
3        **WHEREAS,** it is incumbent upon the Guam Legislature to recognize those  
4        remarkable individuals who have honorably and courageously served our country in  
5        order to protect the life and liberty of our citizens, and whose military service,  
6        professional lives and civic endeavors serve to enhance the stature of this great island

1 of Guam; and members of the U.S. Armed Services who have served honorably  
2 during times of war and peace deserve a special salute from this august body; and

3 **WHEREAS**, attendant to such concern, and in full accord with its long-  
4 standing traditions, the Guam Legislature is justly proud to honor Captain Noel  
5 Molina Enriquez on the occasion of his retirement from the United States Navy after  
6 thirty (30) years of dedicated military service; and his distinguished military career  
7 will be celebrated at a retirement ceremony on July 2, 2014; and

8 **WHEREAS**, in May 1984, Captain Noel Molina Enriquez, the son of Benjamin  
9 Luna Enriquez and Remedios Molina Enriquez, was commissioned as an Ensign after  
10 graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in General Engineering from the U.S.  
11 Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland; and his celebrated military career began at  
12 his alma mater, where he instructed over one thousand (1,000) cadets at the Academy;  
13 and

14 **WHEREAS**, after attending Surface Warfare Officer School in Coronado,  
15 California, Captain Enriquez reported to the USS HALEAKALA (AE-25) on March  
16 1985, expeditiously qualifying to serve as a Surface Warfare Officer within a single  
17 year, a certification process that normally takes two years; and

18 **WHEREAS**, in September 1986, Captain Enriquez served as the First Division  
19 Deck Officer, and as Navigator, successfully steering the USS Haleakala over five  
20 thousand (5,000) nautical miles from California to its new homeport of the U.S. Naval  
21 Station Guam; and

22 **WHEREAS**, in February 1989, Captain Enriquez was assigned to the USS  
23 PRINCETON (CG-59) where he served his final active duty assignment as the  
24 Electrical and Auxiliaries Officer; and he accepted a Reserve commission in January  
25 1990, and reported to NR USS MEYERKORD (FF-1058) as the Assistant  
26 Engineering Officer; and

1           **WHEREAS**, in August 1991, Captain Enriquez relocated to Guam and  
2 reported to Volunteer Training Unit 3006 (VTU-3006). In August 1993, he was  
3 assigned to Naval Reserve Unit Guam 120 (NRU Guam 120) where he served as the  
4 Commanding Officer of over forty (40) Guam reservists, from September to  
5 December 1995; and

6           **WHEREAS**, Captain Enriquez's unit received the Humanitarian Service Medal  
7 for its support in the rescue and tracking efforts in response to the crash of Korean Air  
8 Lines Flight 801, in 1997; and he remained with the NRU Guam 120 until 2000; and

9           **WHEREAS**, after September 11, 2001, Captain Enriquez returned to active  
10 duty and served as the Assistant Chief of Staff for the Joint Rear Area Coordinator-  
11 Guam in support of Operation Enduring Freedom; and his scope of responsibilities  
12 included planning and managing the homeland protection of Guam and the  
13 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), which was achieved  
14 through coordination among various Guam and U.S. Pacific military commands,  
15 federal and local law enforcement entities, and emergency service agencies; and

16           **WHEREAS**, following the widespread calamity that ensued after Super  
17 Typhoon *Pongsona* barreled through Micronesia in December 2002, Captain Enriquez  
18 supported the government of Guam's disaster recovery efforts, serving as the military  
19 liaison in response to the Mobil Oil tank farm fire; and

20           **WHEREAS**, in October 2003, Captain Enriquez was handpicked to establish  
21 one of two overseas U.S. Naval Reserve Centers in the world, the first of its kind on  
22 Guam, that opened in October 2006; with the Guam Center currently supporting over  
23 one hundred fifty-eight (158) Navy Reservists, ninety-eight (98) of whom make Guam  
24 their home; and

25           **WHEREAS**, from April 2005 to September 2006, Captain Enriquez also  
26 supported Navy Region Marianas as the Assistant Chief of Staff/Regional Program

1 Director, where he directed Quality of Life (QOL) programs for over sixteen thousand  
2 five hundred (16,500) authorized patrons, who were primarily Guam veterans and  
3 their families; and

4 **WHEREAS**, in July 2006, Captain Enriquez was appointed to his current rank,  
5 becoming the first unrestricted line U.S. Navy Reserve Officer from Guam to be  
6 appointed to that rank in many years; and

7 **WHEREAS**, upon release from active duty in October 2006, Captain Enriquez  
8 served as the Navy Emergency Preparedness Liaison Officer (NEPLO) for Navy  
9 Region Marianas, from January 2007 to December 2009, providing military support  
10 during preparedness exercises and disasters on Guam, the Commonwealth of the  
11 Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), Hawaii, and the continental United States; and

12 **WHEREAS**, in October 2007, Captain Enriquez was the senior U.S. military  
13 representative for full-scale exercises on Guam; and after completing his tour as the  
14 NEPLO in December 2009, he became the Commanding Officer of VTU-3006 and  
15 two other Navy Reserve units responsible for over thirty (30) Guam-based reserve  
16 members supporting active duty commands on Guam, Japan and Korea; and

17 **WHEREAS**, in the promotion of scholarships and invaluable career  
18 opportunities for the youth within our island communities, Captain Enriquez  
19 established the U.S. Naval Academy Blue & Gold Officer position for Guam and the  
20 CNMI in January 1995; and to date, he has interviewed one hundred seventy-six (176)  
21 high school student applicants, with thirty (30) students being directly appointed to the  
22 U.S. Naval Academy or Preparatory School; and

23 **WHEREAS**, beginning in 2000, Captain Enriquez served as a board member  
24 for the Junior Achievement (JA) of Guam for six years; and as a non-profit youth  
25 organization, the JA had inspired over one thousand (1,000) Guam high school  
26 students during the course of his tenure; and

1           **WHEREAS**, one of his many engagements in civic activities was when  
2 Captain Enriquez served as a co-coordinator in the reconstruction and rededication of  
3 the Saint Jude Thaddeus Church in *Sinajaña* in November 2003 after Super Typhoon  
4 *Pongsona* had destroyed the building the previous year; and

5           **WHEREAS**, Captain Enriquez had also served as a Guam United Service  
6 Organizations, Inc. (USO) advisory board member from 2006 to 2011, and he helped  
7 to revive the Guam USO Center that has welcomed over one hundred thousand  
8 (100,000) service members and their families since its reopening; and

9           **WHEREAS**, since 2006, Captain Enriquez has served as an officer and a board  
10 member of the Society of American Military Engineers – Guam Post, a civic group  
11 that has provided over One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) in scholarships to  
12 prospective and current engineering and architecture students who have graduated  
13 from Guam high schools, or regional high schools; and

14           **WHEREAS**, on July 1, 2014, Captain Enriquez will have served for thirty (30)  
15 years in the U.S. Navy; and outside of his active and reserve duty capacity, he has  
16 assertively supported the Guam community by volunteering, a pursuit he shares with  
17 his family, which includes his wife, the former Anita Janet Borja; his two sons,  
18 Nathaniel Jesus Enriquez and Nicholas James Enriquez; and his stepdaughter,  
19 Vanessa Lee Williams; and

20           **WHEREAS**, it is the sense of the Guam Legislature to acknowledge the  
21 significant milestones in the distinguished careers of esteemed individuals of this  
22 island; and those individuals who dedicate their lives to U.S. military service merit the  
23 commendation and applause of all U.S. citizens for their commitment to the  
24 preservation of American freedom. In his official acts, Captain Noel Molina Enriquez  
25 was governed by a sense of loyalty, duty and honor, which allowed him to be a natural  
26 leader within our country and our community-at-large; now therefore, be it

1           **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Dos Na*  
2 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people  
3 of Guam, honor, commend, and congratulate Captain Noel Molina Enriquez on the  
4 occasion of his retirement from the United States Navy after thirty (30) years of  
5 dedicated military service; and be it further


6           **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
