1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI KUÅTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Angel (Sonny) Lujan Orsini was born on December 14, 1968, and was the son of the late †Cecilia Lujan (*familian Capili yan familian Lazaro*) of Barrigada and the late †Angel B. Orsini of Bicol, Philippines; and

WHEREAS, Sonny was called to his eternal rest on July 25, 2017 at forty-eight
(48) years of age and is survived by his loving wife of twenty-one (21) years,
Kimberly and his children and granddaughter, Joshua (Jacqueline), Leonardo, and
Isabella; and

WHEREAS, Sonny attended P.C. Lujan Elementary School, San Vicente
Catholic School, and Untalan Middle School; and in 1985, he graduated from George
Washington High School at the age of sixteen (16). Sonny first pursued his interest in

policymaking in the eleventh (11th) Guam Youth Congress and twelfth (12th) Guam
 Youth Congress, in which he served as Speaker; and

WHEREAS, Sonny studied Political Science at the University of Guam and served his peers in the Student Government Association. He later transferred to Bennington College in Vermont where he studied politics under his tutor and former Ambassador to the United Nations Mansour Farhang, and pursued his studies in Political Economy of Development with Michael Rock and Andrew Pienkos, two distinguished development economists; and

WHEREAS, Sonny was one of the first of a generation of leaders to be trained
 in the art and craft of contemporary politics under the tutelage of his mentor, the late
 †Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo; and

WHEREAS, Sonny worked for the late †Senator Elizabeth P. (Belle) Arriola as staff assistant, for then-Senator Carl T.C. Gutierrez as budget analyst for the Committee on Ways and Means, and for then-Senator Madeleine Z. Bordallo as press assistant during her historic 1990 gubernatorial campaign as the first female candidate for governor of Guam; and

WHEREAS, in 1991, Sonny moved on to serve the late U.S. †Senator Edward
M. (Ted) Kennedy, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Labor and Human
Resources, addressing issues of education, health care, and labor at the national level;
and

WHEREAS, in 1993, Sonny answered the call to serve the people of Guam and returned home from his studies to run for senator. He was elected to the *I Mina'bente Tres Liheslatura* (23rd Guam Legislature), at the age of twenty-four (24) and sworn in at the age of twenty-five (25), becoming the youngest senator elected to the Guam Legislature; and WHEREAS, Sonny, as a freshman senator, was entrusted and selected by his
 colleagues to serve as Chairperson of the powerful and coveted Committee on Rules
 in *I Mina 'bente Tres Liheslatura* (23rd Guam Legislature); and

WHEREAS, Sonny successfully implemented an aggressive legislative agenda.
Within a single term, he reduced operating costs by eliminating the accrual of sick
leave for senators, as well as foresaw new industries such as aquaculture and provided
for its development. Sonny also recognized the importance of preserving our island
paradise and established the Islandwide Beautification Task Force. Further, Sonny
provided legal redress for people denied their tax refunds from the government; and

WHEREAS, Sonny, after serving the people of Guam as a senator, returned to
 the mainland to serve the finest smoked meats as a smoke master, founding Orsini's
 BBQ in Burlington, Vermont and learned and mastered the culinary arts, one of his
 first passions; and

WHEREAS, Sonny, in his ultimate homecoming, returned to Guam with his family, and established Åsu Smokehouse with his brother Cecil (Buddy) Orsini at the Chamorro Village in Hagåtña, Guam in 2013, an award-winning smokehouse distinguished by its use of fresh, local, and organic products, the immense amount of time and exceptional care and attention given to smoking its Certified Angus Beef, its specialty cuts, and its business motto "Passion before profit;" and

WHEREAS, Sonny, in addition to his extensive intellect, political acumen, charisma, and unparalleled oratory skills, had a hopeful view of the world and saw the good in everyone. He had an innate ability to empathize with others and effectively communicate their needs; and

24 WHEREAS, Sonny compassionately worked to lift up the oppressed and 25 disadvantaged because he recognized, with profound wisdom and perception, the inequity that exists between the powerful and the powerless that society has
 systemically reinforced throughout history and its institutions; and

WHEREAS, Sonny was a principled public servant and statesman who lived his life with the guiding principle that it is not what you do when people are watching that matters, rather it is what you do when no one is around. He honored his word and commitments and was a man of faith who cherished his family above all else; and

7 WHEREAS, Sonny, even in the years after his time in public office, continued 8 to advocate for what is in the best interests for the people of Guam and inspired 9 incumbent and aspiring leaders to do the same making the impact he has left in our 10 world vast and immeasurable. His spirit and legacy will live on in each person he has 11 touched; now, therefore, be it

12 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Kuåttro Na* 13 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people 14 of Guam, posthumously commemorate and distinguish the accomplishments and 15 dedication of the late Honorable Angel (Sonny) Lujan Orsini, former Senator and true 16 public servant who fought for social justice and was a voice for the voiceless and 17 powerless; and to further extend the sincere condolences of the people of Guam and *I* 18 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* to the Orsini family on his passing; and be it further

19 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules 20 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of 21 the same be thereafter transmitted to the family and children of the late Honorable 22 Angel (Sonny) Lujan Orsini; to the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam Delegate 23 to the United States Congress; to Chief Justice Robert J. Torres, Judiciary of Guam; 24 and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
