BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI KUATTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, the Honorable Consul Edgar Tomas Quilino Auxilian was born on March 7, 1964 in Casay, Anini-y, Antique, Philippines; and he is the son of Dominador Rubite Auxilian and Felipa Yarde Quilino; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, Consul Auxilian graduated as an Outstanding Pupil of Casay Elementary School in Casay, Anini-y, Antique, Philippines; and in 1980, he graduated as the Valedictorian of St. Therese's High School in Casay, Anini-y, Antique, Philippines; and

WHEREAS, in 1984, Consul Auxilian continued in his pursuit of higher education and attended the University of the Philippines in Diliman, Quezon City, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science. Furthermore, from 1984 to 1990, he continued to acquire higher education at the University of the Philippines in Diliman, Quezon City, where he completed his Master of Public Administration thesis; and, in 1992, he completed his Master of Administrative Services at the German University of Administrative Sciences (formerly Post Graduate School of Administrative Services) in Speyer, Federal Republic of Germany, with a scholarship grant from the German Foundation for International Development; and

WHEREAS, Consul Auxilian is married to Mrs. Maria Vita Ecalin-Auxilian, M.D., with whom he has two (2) children; and

WHEREAS, throughout his career, Consul Auxilian was awarded with numerous monumental awards and recognitions in the Philippines and internationally that has given pride to the Philippines and to Filipino worldwide; and

WHEREAS, in 1985, Consul Auxilian served as a research assistant, a research associate, and then a researcher at the Local Government Center at the College of Public Administration at the University of the Philippines in Diliman, Quezon City; and

WHEREAS, Consul Auxilian passed the Civil Service Professional examinations in 1986, the Foreign Service Officers' examinations in 1996, and the Career Ministers' examinations in 2016; and

WHEREAS, from 1997 to 2011, Consul Auxilian served in multiple roles with the Department of Foreign Affairs, beginning as Principal Assistant of the Policy Division of the Association of Southeast Nations, and eventually assuming the role of Acting Executive Director of the Department's Office of Protocol; and

WHEREAS, from September 30, 2011 to February 15, 2012, Consul Auxilian served as Consul and Acting Head of Post of the Philippine Consulate General in Agaña, Guam; and

WHEREAS, on February 25, 2012, Consul Auxilian took part in the celebration of the Twenty-seventh (27<sup>th</sup>) Year Anniversary of the Epifanio de los Santos Avenue People Power Revolution, where he reminded guests of the historical importance of the events that put an end to the autocratic rule of the Marcos administration and ushered in the restoration of democracy in the Philippines. Furthermore, he spoke of Filipinos as being full of hope again, with the bright prospects of the Philippines emerging as a new tiger in Asia and one of the strongest economies in the world in the years to come; and

WHEREAS, from October 1, 2012 to November 15, 2012, Consul Auxilian served as Acting Head of Post of the Philippine Consulate General in Saipan, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; and

WHEREAS, on October 3, 2014, Consul Auxilian, upon the invitation of the Guam Agency for Human Resources Development (AHRD) and the U.S. Navy in Guam, toured the USS George Washington, which was docked in Apra Harbor at U.S. Naval Base, Guam, where he thanked LTJG Hans "Stas" Tooley, a pilot of one of the helicopters that brought relief goods for the typhoon victims in Tacloban City in November of 2013, as well as his other colleagues; and

WHEREAS, in October of 2014, Consul Auxilian travelled to Palau to assist and conduct a Mobile Consular Mission, where he was able to help process over one hundred (100) ePassports and provide consular services closer to Filipinos living and working in Palau. Furthermore, he conducted similar missions for our neighbors to the north in Saipan beginning in November of 2014, September of 2015, and November of 2016; and

WHEREAS, in June of 2015, Consul Auxilian joined the Government of Guam in its Trade Mission to the Philippines, where he assisted the Guam delegation in its efforts and promotions during the trade mission; and

WHEREAS, in September of 2015, Consul Auxilian joined the Fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) Annual 5K Run Fun Drive entitled, "Run for our *Mamula'*" or "Run for our Brothers and Sisters" in Saipan; and he led the Consulate General's staff and the participants from the Guam community in raising funds to assist the Filipinos and others living in Saipan that were affected by Typhoon Soudelor; and

WHEREAS, Consul Auxilian broadened his portfolio by actively participating in a number of seminars, conferences, and international trainings, to include serving as the Liaison Officer for the Prime Minister of Singapore during the 2015 Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation Meeting in Manila; and he received commendations from the Executive Secretary, Office of the President, and the Secretary of Foreign Affairs for serving as such; and

WHEREAS, in February of 2016, Consul Auxilian conducted the first mobile consular outreach program for Palau, which has been a regular program/activity of the Consulate General since it assumed consular jurisdiction over Palau and the Federated States of Micronesia, starting in 2013, to bring the various consular services closer to Filipinos living and working in these islands who for various reasons would have difficulty coming to Guam. Furthermore, he conducted a second mobile consular mission in August of 2017; and

WHEREAS, in June of 2017, Consul Auxilian expressed his appreciation to the Government of Guam for the recognition accorded to Filipinos for their contribution on to the good of their community during the 2017 Philippine Independence Month Proclamation; and

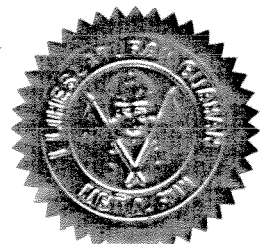


