**WHEREAS**, through a close partnership with the Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services, the local government agency that is tasked with identifying patients for the *Shriners Hospital for Children*, a medical mission is held twice a year on Guam; and the *Guam Shrine Club* provides support to both the visiting patients and doctors; and

**WHEREAS**, the *Guam Shrine Club* depends on its various partnerships with local businesses, individual donations, and fundraising activities, such as bingo fundraisers, to raise funds for the children's transportation expenses to help patients and their families travel to Honolulu for treatment at the *Shriners Hospital for Children* or at the *Shriners Burns Hospital for Children* in Galveston, Texas; and

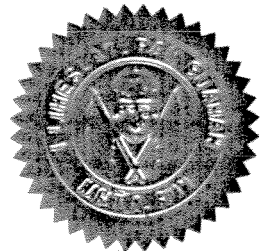
