Relative to recognizing and commending the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center; Prevention and Training Branch (PEACE Office), for their efforts in coordinating and collaborating the Guam events in the fight against suicide as we wish to Break the S;lence: Tell Your Story, in commemorating National Suicide Prevention Month to our island and our people.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI KUATTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, Suicide is a public health issue as there is a high prevalence of suicide on Guam; and
- WHEREAS, suicide is the seventh (7<sup>th)</sup> leading cause of death. In 2017, there have been 23 deaths in Guam, averaging about one every two weeks: and
- WHEREAS, in our diverse population in 2016, one in three suicide deaths occur among those ages 20-29 years of age. Suicide rates are highest among those ages 30-39 years of age; and
- WHEREAS, male suicide rates are 5 times higher than females rates on Guam.

  60% of suicide deaths took place in the home; and

WHEREAS, Chuukese and Chamorro's maintain the highest rates of suicide on Guam. Guam's suicide death rate is 55% higher than the U.S. national rate; and

WHEREAS, the risk of suicide exists in multiple layers with the impact of each suicide death on family members, friends and other individuals. Every day, we encounter individuals who are fighting for strength and courage to cope and continue to live despite their pain and loss; and

WHEREAS, with help, there is hope. Guam has seen a growing number of trained community gatekeepers – those who have been trained in evidence-based trainings on suicide prevention, intervention and postvention. These gatekeepers are regular individuals with extraordinary willingness to help others whose lives are at risk. They are counselors, teachers, nurses and doctors who are willing to go beyond the surface in caring for their students and patients. They are also parents, siblings, best friends, classmates and coworkers who are concerned about their loved one. Suicide is a tough subject to talk about, but they took on the challenge of surpassing the shame and taboo associated with it; and

WHEREAS, suicide is becoming everyone's business. As of early 2016, there are over 3,000 individuals trained in suicide prevention and first aid skills. Trainings such as safeTALK, ASIST and Connect continue to be offered to the island community through Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center and its partner agencies, namely: The *I Pinangon* Campus Suicide Prevention Center, Inafa'Maolek Mediation Center, Guam Department of Education (GDOE), Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS, Guam Memorial Hospital (GMH), and The Guam Army National Guard; and

WHEREAS, resources for help are growing to address the issue of suicide in various levels in Guam's community. Suicide and substance use prevention efforts

- 1 have been provided through the PEACE Partnerships for Success grant's ten (10)
- 2 community non-profit organizations; prevention programs have been provided in
- 3 public and private elementary through secondary schools, youth residential treatment
