## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAL KUÅTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, Family Violence means the occurrence of one (1) or more of the following acts by a family or household member, but does not include acts of self- defense or defense of others: attempting to cause or causing bodily injury to another family or household member; and placing a family or household member in fear of bodily injury; and

WHEREAS, violence and abuse can happen to anyone regardless of race, age, sexual orientation, religion or gender; and it affects people of all socioeconomic backgrounds and education levels, yet the problem is often overlooked, excused or denied; and

WHEREAS, violence and abuse occur in both opposite-gender and samegender relationships; and can happen to intimate partners who are married, living together or dating; and

WHEREAS, violence not only affects those who are abused, but also has a substantial effect on family members, friends, co-workers, other witnesses, and the community at large; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to end the violence, Guam's leaders, community advocates, and the youth have taken the opportunity to come together and give the victims of this ongoing crisis a voice; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to end the violence, the Guam Legislature and the Office of the Attorney General of Guam created the Family Violence Registry, a website designed to help ensure the safety and well-being of the public by providing any person who utilizes this website with an opportunity to obtain information relating to the criminal history records of offenders who have repeat convictions of family, domestic, or dating violence, and/or stalking; and

WHEREAS, recent studies have shown that the level of family violence and sexual assault on Guam is still reaching an alarming amount. A new survey conducted on September 14, 2016 by the National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV) reported that, in one (1) twenty-four (24)-hour period, forty-four (44) victims of domestic violence on Guam, and their children, received life-saving services from local domestic violence organizations. Domestic violence hotlines are a lifeline for victims in danger, providing support, information, safety planning, and resources. In the twenty-four (24)-hour survey period, local and state hotline staff answered thirteen (13) calls. On the survey day, fifteen (15) individuals in communities across Guam attended one (1) training session provided by local domestic violence programs, gaining much needed information on domestic violence prevention and early intervention; and

1 WHEREAS, the Family Violence and Sexual Assault practitioners and 2 advocates, the STOP Violence Against Women sub-grantees, government and non-3 Governmental organizations, faith-based organizations, and other community 4 partners have joined forces to directly and collectively confront this family 5 violence crisis.
