Relative to recognizing and congratulating Maria Artero Catholic Preschool and Kindergarten (MACPK) and the local Mercedarian Missionaries of Berriz (MMB) on the special occasion of their Golden Jubilee; and to further expressing Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse' to the staff for continuing to strive to educate our children by providing an enriched learning environment so that they may develop their talents and a lifelong desire for learning and service to others.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 MINA'TRENTAI KUÂTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

WHEREAS, The Mercedarian Missionaries of Berriz are a Catholic missionary
community of religious sisters who have been in the Mariana Islands since 1928,
working first on Saipan and then on Guam beginning in 1962; and

WHEREAS, in the 1920's, one of the nuns of the cloistered Mercedarian convent
 of Berriz in Vizcaya, Spain, Margarita Lopez de Maturana, was inspired to support the
 Catholic overseas missions. Besides encouraging prayers for the missions, Sr. Margarita
 organized fund raising efforts and sent cards and material assistance to the missions;
 and

WHEREAS, in 1928, Mother Margarita sent the first Mercedarian missionaries to Saipan, their first Pacific mission. Later that same year, a second Pacific mission was opened in Pohnpei. In 1936, the sisters began a mission in Chuuk. After World War II, the Mercedarians resumed their work which spread to other islands in Micronesia; and WHEREAS, in 1962, the Mercedarian sisters came to Guam to open a house for Mercedarians in transit and for the sisters needing medical attention on Guam. These sisters, who lived in a house in Sinajana, were Maria Camino Julia, Teresa Pagazaortundua, and Justa Izaguirre. That same year the island was hit by Typhoon Karen which damaged their home and they had to leave Guam; and

WHEREAS, in 1966, they returned to the island when they were given a house 6 in Agana Heights. It was the gift of the late owner, Maria Cruz Artero. When the sisters 7 asked Bishop Baumgartner how they could serve the church on Guam, he told them that 8 there was a need for Catholic Pre-schools. The sisters then used the ground floor of the 9 Artero house as a pre-school and so in gratitude to their benefactor and her memory 10 they named it in honor of their benefactor. On October 17, 1967, the nursery opened its 11 doors in Agana Heights. Sisters Mary Louise Balzarini and Cecilia Tudela were the first 12 to open the nursery. The nursery has expanded in size and enrollment over the years; 13 14 and

## WHEREAS, in 1968, the Maria Artero Nursery had their first graduation, with the children in white caps and gowns; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, Typhoon Pamela destroyed the Convent and the school,
which was later rebuilt to the existing building; and

WHEREAS, in May 2003, it incorporated and amended its name to Maria Artero
 Catholic Preschool and Kindergarten; and

WHEREAS, MACPK started with only two (2) staff and fifty-five (55) students.
 The school currently has a staff of four (4) staff, (3) nuns and (1) lay person. Throughout

- 23 the fifty years, more than ten thousand children have graduated from the school; and
- 24 WHEREAS, over the years, they have been fortunate enough to have Parents 25 who are very supportive, generous, and much involved in all the schools' activities; and

WHEREAS, their Parent Teachers Association have organized mini fundraisers 1 such as Spaghetti Night, MC Teacher's Night, Bake Sales, Car washes, Read-A-Thons, 2 Tupperware and Avon Fundraisers, Yard Sales, and Pizza nights to raise money for 3 4 student activities; and

WHEREAS, every school year they usually have three to four field trips 6 depending on lessons learned; and

WHEREAS, the house has been the regional leadership center for the 7 Micronesian area. Mercedarian sisters living in the Agana Heights convent have also 8 worked or taught at the University of Guam, the Micronesian Area Research Center, 9 Father Duenas Memorial School, and Bishop Baumgartner Memorial School. One 10 Sister was Director of Religious Education for the Diocese and nearly every Sister 11 stationed on Guam has assisted at Catholic Campus Ministry at the University of Guam. 12 Many Sisters at the Parish of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament in Agana Heights have 13 served as Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) teachers, lectors, Eucharistic 14 Ministers, and in youth ministry. Some have also taught in the University of Maryland 15 Anderson Air Force Base program. To date there are about fifty (50) Mercedarian sisters 16 working in Micronesia; and now therefore, be it 17
