WHEREAS, On October 6, 2017 Lieutenant Governor Ray Tenorio proclaimed October 2017 as "Breast Cancer Awareness Month", to encourage citizens, government agencies, private businesses, nonprofit organizations, and all other interested groups to join in activities that will increase awareness of what our community of Guam can do to prevent breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, Breast Cancer Awareness Month is an annual campaign to raise awareness of breast cancer risks, the value of screening and early detection, and treatment options available to women and men who are diagnosed with one of the many forms of breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, breast cancer in young women is more aggressive, and any delays in diagnosis and treatment can have serious consequences, many of

which could be countered by breast cancer education and awareness; and

WHEREAS, the National Breast Cancer Foundation (NBCF) recommends that women ages 40 to 44 should have the choice to start annual breast cancer screening with mammograms if they wish to do so; women; women age 45 to 54 should get mammograms every year; women age 55 and older should switch to mammograms every two (2) years, or can continue yearly screening; screening should continue as long as a woman is in good health and is expected to live 10 more years or longer; and all women should be familiar with the known benefits, limitations, and potential harms linked to breast cancer screening; and

WHEREAS, Guam has seen roughly three hundred (300) cases of breast cancer over the year; and according to the NBCF, more than two hundred forty nine thousand (249,000) people in the United States are diagnosed with invasive breast cancer every year, and nearly forty one thousand (41,000) die from the disease; and

WHEREAS, older women, and those who have a personal or family history of breast cancer, are among those at greatest risk of developing the illness, and early detection is key in the fight against the disease; and

WHEREAS, screening with mammograms can help detect breast cancer in its early stages, and persons of both sexes should speak with their health care providers about this disease to learn more about the symptoms, diagnosis, and treatment of breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, breast cancer remains the most common cancer diagnosed in Guamanians; and is the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) leading cause of cancer death among Guam's women; and

WHEREAS, the staff of Guam Cancer Care, along with organizations
