WHEREAS, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero was born in Tamuning, Guam, on August 2, 1962, and is the second child of six (6) children, including, Wilfred, Gina, Alysia, Phyllis, and Nadine; born to Dr. Wilfred and Mrs. Virginia Artero Leon Guerrero, residents of Asan, Guam. Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero was originally from the village of Tumon Heights, and now resides in the village of Mangilao; and

9 WHEREAS, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero attended St. Anthony 10 School in Tamuning. He graduated from Father Duenas Memorial High School in 11 Mangilao in 1980, and later went on to receive his Bachelor of Arts degree in Political 12 Science from the University of Guam in 1989. He was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant, after successfully completing the Army Reserve Officer Training Corps,
 from the University of Guam on May 16, 1988 ; and

WHEREAS, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero is married to Mary
Cruz, and they are blessed with two (2) sons, Jared and Broderick, and a daughter,
Crystal; and

WHEREAS, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero enlisted in the Guam 6 7 Army National Guard in 1985 as a Private First Class where he went to Basic Training and attended the Combat Medic Advanced Individual Training. He was assigned as a 8 Combat Medic in the 838<sup>th</sup> Medical Company. He was promoted to Specialist in 1986, 9 and later appointed as a Cadet. After commissioning in May 1988, his initial 10 assignments were as the S2, Intelligence Officer, Executive Officer for Headquaters parents provered and Headquarters Company, 1-294th Infantry Battalion; 731st Military Police 2 13 Company Commander; and

WHEREAS, after command, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero was 14 selected for the Active Guard Reserve (AGR) program where he was assigned to 15 multiple positions from 1991 to 2007, that included Personnel Officer, G1; Assistant 16 Professor of Military Science, University of Guam Army ROTC; Recruiting and 17 Retention Manager; Deputy G3, Guam Army National Guard; Plans, Operations 18 Mobilization Support Officer; Weapons of Mass Destruction/Civil Support Team 19 Commander; Commander, 94th Civil Support Team; and J3, Guam National Guard; 20 21 and

WHEREAS, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero's military education includes: Security Managers Course at the National Defense Institution in Arizona in 1990; and Military Police Officer Basic Course at Ft. McClellan, Alabama in 1991. His career afforded several training opportunities at Camp Robinson in Arkansas, to include: Total Quality Management and Personnel Officer in 1993; Future Planners in 1994; and Officer in Charge in 1996. Additional courses completed by Major General
 Roderick R. Leon Guerrero were the Adjutant General Officers Advanced Course at
 Ft. Jackson, South Carolina, in 1996. He completed the Combined Arms Staff Service
 Course at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, in 1996, and the Command General Staff
 College in 2005 where he holds a Master of Science degree in Strategic Studies from
 the United States Army War College. Prior to deploying to Afghanistan, he completed
 the Embedded Military Transition Training Course at Ft Riley, Kansas, in 2007; and

8 WHEREAS, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero was deployed in 9 support of Operation Enduring Freedom. He deployed with the first Embedded 10 Training Team from the Guam Army National Guard to Afghanistan from February 11 2007 to May 2008 as the J1, 203<sup>rd</sup> Afghan Regional Security Command- East 12 operating out of Forward Operating Base Lightning; and

WHEREAS, after his deployment, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero
returned to Guam and served concurrently as the Commander, 105<sup>th</sup> Troop Command
and as the J1, Guam National Guard from May 2008 to July 2009; and in July 2009,
he relinquished command of the 105<sup>th</sup> Troop Command and remained the J1, Guam
National Guard until April 2014; and

WHEREAS, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero was then selected as Chief of Joint Staff for the Guam National Guard and served in this position from April 2014 until March 2015; and then assumed the duties and responsibilities as the 11<sup>th</sup> Adjutant General of the Guam National Guard in March 2015; and

WHEREAS, Major General Roderick R. Leon Guerrero's badges, awards, and decorations include: Combat Action and Parachute Badges; the Legion of Merit; the Bronze Star Medal; Meritorious Service Medals (with 2nd Oak Leaf Clusters); the Army Commendation Medal (with 3rd Oak Leaf Clusters); the Army Commendation Medal (with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters); the Army Achievement Medal; the Air Force Achievement Medal; the Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal; the National
 Defense Service Medal (with Bronze Star); the Afghanistan Campaign Medal; the
 Global War on Terrorism Service Ribbon; the Humanitarian Service Ribbon; the
 Army Service Ribbon; the Overseas Service Ribbon; and the North Atlantic Treaty
 Organization (NATO) Medal; and
