1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI KUÅTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*: 1 WHEREAS, it is the custom of the Guam Legislature to acknowledge official 2 days that are set aside to increase awareness of serious issues that affect the lives of the 3 people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, attendant to such concern, and in full accord with its longstanding
traditions, the Guam Legislature is moved to recognize the observance of World AIDS
Day on Friday, December 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, World AIDS Day is observed annually on December 1 every year,
bringing people together from around the world to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS;
and since 1995, the President of the United States of America has made an official
proclamation on World AIDS Day; and

WHEREAS, World AIDS Day is an opportunity for public and private partners to spread awareness about the status of the pandemic, and to encourage progress in HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment and care, here on Guam and around the world; and

WHEREAS, initiated by the United Nations and first observed in 1988, World AIDS Day was the first-ever global health day declared; and commemorating the day presents an opportunity to demonstrate international solidarity in the face of the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, HIV/AIDS continues to be a major global public health issue, as the disease has claimed more than twenty-five million (25,000,000) lives over the past three (3) decades, making it one of the most destructive epidemics in recorded history; and

WHEREAS, more than one million two hundred thousand (1,200,000) Americans are living with HIV; and an estimated fifty thousand (50,000) new HIV infections are occurring each year. On Guam, two hundred fifty-three (253) cases of HIV infections have been reported since 1985; and approximately sixty-seven (67) people currently have HIV; and

1 WHEREAS, in alignment with the National HIV/AIDS Strategy (NHS), the 2 Guam HIV Planning Group (HPG), whose mission is to "identify new HIV infections 3 and reduce HIV-related disparities through the collaboration and coordination of prevention, care, and treatment services on our island," plays a critical role in the 4 seamless coordination of partnerships of public and private organizations, such as 5 6 WestCare Pacific Islands (WCPI); Guam's Alternative Lifestyle Association (GALA); 7 the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center; the University of Guam; the Guam 8 Department of Public Health and Social Services Family Planning, Maternal Child Health, Immunization, and Tuberculosis Programs; the Guam Department of 9 10 Education; Sanctuary, Incorporated; the Oasis Empowerment Center; the Guam 11 Coalition Against Sexual Assault and Family Violence; the Salvation Army, and other 12 community members; and

WHEREAS, to date, WestCare Pacific Islands (WCPI) and Guam's Alternative
 Lifestyle Association (GALA) are the only two (2) community-based organizations on
 Guam that retain certified STD/HIV prevention counselors and implement HIV Rapid
 Testing and STD testing; and

WHEREAS, local efforts are ongoing to promote greater access to treatment, 17 18 including antiretroviral drugs, so that people living with HIV (PLWH) can continue to 19 avail of the HIV continuum of care services and enjoy healthy and productive lives; and WHEREAS, given the substantial biological evidence demonstrating the 20 21increased likelihood of both HIV transmission and acquisition in the presence of other 22 sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) like chlamydia, gonorrhea and syphilis, 23 unprotected sex, already a proven risk factor for HIV transmission, must continue to be 24 addressed through cross collaboration among community stakeholders as an important 25 strategy to curb new HIV infections; and

WHEREAS, although Guam is considered a low HIV prevalence area, local 1 efforts must be sustained to prevent an HIV epidemic. The Guam HIV Planning Group's 2 role is to ensure that the island's resources are directed toward strengthening STD and 3 HIV prevention and care efforts. Additionally, HPG continues to ensure the provision 4 of interventions to key populations, such as men who have sex with men (MSM), 5 injection drug users (IDU), and pregnant women at risk for STDs, with a special focus 6 on developing sexual reproductive health and responsibility programs, and behavioral 7 wellness programs, among young people ages fifteen (15) to twenty-five (25); and 8

9 WHEREAS, public and private partnerships boost the island's effort to respond 10 to HIV by advocating for appropriately developed programs that promote sexual 11 reproductive health and behavioral health and wellness, and whose implementation is 12 geared towards the eradication of AIDS; and

WHEREAS, as we observe World AIDS Day on December 1, this year's Guam theme of "*LOVE. HOPE. LIFE*" reminds us that our work is far from over in reducing shame and stigma surrounding HIV/AIDS, and that we must recommit ourselves to push the pace of change, without ceasing, to create an AIDS-free generation; and

WHEREAS, the activities planned for Guam's observance of World AIDS Day
2017 would not be possible were it not for the collective efforts and commitment of the
following organizations and individuals: the Guam HIV Planning Group (HPG),
WestCare Pacific Islands (WCPI), Guam's Alternative Lifestyle Association (GALA),
the students of the University of Guam's Introduction to Community Services (SW110) and Generalist Social Work Practice Methods (SW-331), and other community
