Relative to observing December as National Impaired Driving Prevention Month, "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" annual mobilization campaign recognized nationwide from December 13 to December 31, 2017.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI KUÅTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan hereby recognizes the month of December 3 as National Impaired Driving Prevention Month, "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" 4 annual mobilization campaign recognized nationwide commends and recognizes the 5 Department of Public Works-Office of Highway Safety, the Guam Police Department 6 Highway Patrol Division, Guam International Airport Authority-Airport Police 7 Division, and the Port Authority of Guam-Port Police Division as the lead agencies in 8 promoting an awareness campaign within our local community and will relentlessly and 9 vigilantly enforce drunk and drugged driving during the holiday season; and 10

WHEREAS, President Barrack Obama in December 2012 designated the month of December as National Impaired Driving Prevention Month and has been celebrated the past fifteen (15) years; and

WHEREAS, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* invites and encourages families, educators, health care providers, and community leaders to promote responsible decision-making and encourages young people to live free of drugs and alcohol; and

WHEREAS, impaired driving includes distracted driving, drugged driving, and drunk driving and on an average year, 30 million Americans drive drunk, and 10 million Americans drive impaired by illicit drugs; and

WHEREAS, a 2010 survey by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) revealed that 13.2 percent of all people aged 16 or older drove under the influence of alcohol and 4.3 percent drove under the influence of illicit drugs during the past year. Furthermore, rates of impaired driving differed dramatically by age. While 11.8 percent of people aged 26 and older drove drunk, 19.5 percent of people aged 16 to 25 drove drunk. And, 2.8 percent of the older group drove drugged, while 11.4 percent of younger drivers did so; and

WHEREAS, December seems particularly suited to this observation because traffic fatalities that involve impaired drivers increase significantly during the Christmas and New Year's holiday periods. On average, 25 people were killed in alcohol-impaired driving crashes per day during the month of December; and

WHEREAS, young adults are among those at greatest risk for driving impaired during the month of December, drivers 21 to 34 years old were alcohol impaired and involved in fatal crashes at a higher percentage than any other age group.

WHEREAS, all 50 States, District of Columbia and Guam enforce the minimum legal drinking age of 21 years. NHTSA asks minors to avoid alcohol, and encourages parents and other caregivers to make a new or renewed commitment to never cater a party to underage drinking. If someone you know is drinking, do not let that person get behind the wheel. If you see an impaired driver on the road, contact law enforcement. Your actions may save someone's life, and inaction could cost a life. Families play an essential part in stopping impaired driving. By talking about the risks and setting clear

expectations, parents and other caregivers can help their children stay safe, sober, and focused on the road; and

WHEREAS, in 2016 there were 13 fatalities, 2 were confirmed to be alcohol related and that through this aggressive educational and enforcement campaign, "Drive Sober or get Pulled Over" our highways and streets would be that much safer; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works-Highway Safety Division's "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" campaign is vital to our island in helping the community reach-out to each other to save a life. Thus, dedicating themselves in promoting driving safe and responsible, and to promote these behaviors among families and friends, and our island community, especially during the holiday season; and

WHEREAS, this multi-agency collaboration sends a message that there will be ZERO tolerance and DUI enforcement checkpoints and more police officers will be out in full force to keep our streets safe and further ask the community to do their part in this campaign to "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over"; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Kuåttro Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, commend and recognizes the Department of Public Works-Highway Safety Division staff and management in this life-saving campaign, the Guam Police Department Highway Patrol Division, Guam International Airport Authority-Airport Police Division, and the Port Authority of Guam-Port Police Division; and expresses an *Un Dángkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'áse'* for their service and dedication in ensuring the protection and safety of our people; and be it further
