

1BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I2MINA'TRENTAI KUÅTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, for the past fifty-five (55) years, the Guam Housing and Urban
Renewal Authority (GHURA) has assisted thousands of low to moderate income renters

and homeowners to acquire suitable housing. GHURA was established by the
enactment of Public Law 6-135 on December 18, 1962 as a result of the destruction in
the aftermath of Supertyphoon Karen in November 1962, when an estimated ninety
percent (90%) of the island's homes and buildings were destroyed or severely damaged;
and

6 WHEREAS, GHURA's purpose is to promote the health, safety, and welfare of Guam's people through the elimination of slum and blighted housing conditions, the 7 orderly redevelopment and renewal of communities, the proper planning of community 8 development, and the provision of safe, decent, and sanitary dwellings for low to 9 moderate income families, and those with special needs, through all of the available 10 federal and local governmental programs, and through the encouragement of Guam's 11 private enterprises to participate in the common task of improving our island 12 13 community, while upholding family values; and

WHEREAS, on behalf of the Government of Guam, GHURA continues to administer affordable housing and community development activities offered through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), with federal programs such as the Public Housing Program, the Housing Choice Voucher Program, the Community Development Block Grant, the HOME Investment Partnerships Program, the Emergency Solutions Grant, the Continuum of Care, and the Low Income Housing Tax Credit Program; and

WHEREAS, GHURA's overarching goal is to provide adequate housing and community planning for those who reside in GHURA-managed housing, and who participate in GHURA-supported rental and homeownership programs and activities across the island, which enables our island residents to fulfill goals of securing safe, decent, and sanitary housing for themselves and their families within well-developed
 island communities. Another goal of GHURA is to create opportunities for its clients'
 successful participation in the workforce, and provide housing in the private/public
 sector; and

5 WHEREAS, GHURA has evolved over the past fifty-five (55) years to meet the 6 changing needs of our island. Initially focusing on urban renewal, GHURA redeveloped 7 and modernized neighborhoods, and it has since then embraced public housing 8 programs by building safe and decent homes for low to moderate income families; and

9 WHEREAS, GHURA has implemented programs to empower clients to
 10 independently seek housing through the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher program;
 11 and

WHEREAS, GHURA has championed public-private partnerships through the
 Low Income Housing Tax Credit program, to encourage corporate investment in the
 development of affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, GHURA is more than just a housing agency, as its mission and goals encompass almost every person in our island community; and, whether they are young, homeless, at-risk youth, disabled, low to moderate income families, single mothers trying to become self-sufficient, or *manåmko* (elderly), GHURA has made a positive impact on their lives; and

WHEREAS, GHURA is a unique agency within the Government of Guam because they receive one hundred percent (100%) of their funding through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and

23 WHEREAS, GHURA's Board of Commissioners provide the overall policy 24 direction for the Authority, while the day-to-day operations are overseen by the

Executive Director, the Deputy Director, twelve (12) Managers, and the hard-working
 staff that ensure that the Authority not only accomplishes its mission, but also keeps up to-date on new and improved techniques of "getting the job done right"; and

WHEREAS, GHURA's dedicated employees are committed to providing a level of service excellence to assist in these efforts, and GHURA personnel also act as a contact for the Fair Housing Act, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation and Americans with Disabilities Act. The Authority actively pursues community partnerships with nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), government, and private entities to allow for the implementation of programs beneficial to island residents, and in particular, GHURA tenants; and

WHEREAS, the GHURA Board of Commissioners, its employees, and community partners both past and present, have built a legacy of ensuring that effective and efficient services are provided to its constituents for over five (5) decades; now therefore, be it
