WHEREAS, the late Honorable Dr. John Camacho Salas was born on January 21, 1948; and was the eldest child of nine (9) children of retired U.S. Navy Chief Petty Officer Steward Juan Chargualaf Salas and Ofra Crisostomo Camacho Salas. In his younger years, he traveled the world with his parents and siblings to his father's various military duty stations before returning to Guam in 1958; and

WHEREAS, upon graduating from Father Dueñas Memorial School in 1965, Senator Salas attended Northern Colorado State College, where he earned his Bachelor's Degree in Industrial Education in 1969; and

WHEREAS, Senator Salas then successfully attained a Master of Arts Degree in Educational Supervision, and a Doctorate in Philosophy in Technical and Industrial Education from the University of Connecticut in 1974; and

WHEREAS, Senator Salas went on to become a Curriculum Specialist of the Connecticut State Department of Education, Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction for the Guam Department of Education Public Schools, consultant to the U.S. Navy Recruiting Command (Eastern Region), and adjunct professor at the University of Connecticut and the University of Bridgeport, Connecticut; and

WHEREAS, Senator Salas was the founding President of the Guam Community College, and was the seventh (7<sup>th</sup>) President of the University of Guam. He concluded his career in education serving as a tenured associate professor of International Tourism at the University of Guam; and

WHEREAS, Senator Salas was also active in areas outside of the educational arena. He served as a talk-show host for K-57 AM radio; he was the first Executive Director of the Guam Hotel and Restaurant Association; he was the Vice President of Human Resources and Community Relations for the Mid-Pacific Division of the Duty Free Shoppers Limited Partnership; and he was the owner of his own consulting firm, specializing in tourism development and human resources; and

WHEREAS, Senator Salas had admirably served the people of Guam as a Senator of the Twenty-fourth (24<sup>th</sup>) and Twenty-fifth (25<sup>th</sup>) Guam Legislatures; and

WHEREAS, Senator Salas was additionally heavily involved in civic organizations, such as the Guam Chapter of the American Red Cross, the Guam Special Olympics, and the *Chamorro* District of the Boy Scouts of America; and he had served as a member of the College of Micronesia Board of Trustees, and as Chairman of the Guam Community College Board of Trustees. He was also a past District Governor of the Lions Club International District 204; and


