BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI KUÁTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÁHAN:

WHEREAS, "Go Red for Women" is the American Heart Association's national movement to end heart disease and stroke in women by advocating and encouraging for more research of heart disease in women, and promoting a healthy lifestyle that nurtures women's cardiovascular health. The "Go Red for Women" movement motivates women to learn of their family's health history and to meet with a health care provider to determine their risk for cardiovascular diseases and stroke; and

WHEREAS, the "Go Red for Women" campaign is being collaboratively mobilized by many local advocates and organizations to join the movement to eliminate heart disease in women on Guam; and

WHEREAS, the month of February 2018 is recognized as "Go Red for Women Month" to harness the power, energy, and passion of women to band together and collectively extinguish heart disease and stroke in women by promoting wellness and fitness; and

WHEREAS, in support of the "Go Red for Women" movement, "National Wear Red Day" urges all citizens to show their support for women and the fight against heart disease, and to commemorate this day by wearing the color red. By increasing awareness, speaking out about heart disease, and empowering women to reduce their risk of cardiovascular diseases, it is possible to save thousands of lives each year; and

WHEREAS, in 2003, the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute introduced the red dress as a national symbol for women and heart disease awareness, which was adopted by the American Heart Association; and which consequently has led to the observance of "National Wear Red Day" on February 2, 2018, to create synergy among all of the organizations that are committed to fighting against heart disease, and are standing in solidarity with women for the awareness and removal of cardiovascular disease in women; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Heart Association, cardiovascular disease in the United States kills approximately one (1) woman every eighty (80) seconds; with heart disease being the number one (1) killer of women, causing one (1) in three (3) deaths each year; and with stroke being the number three (3) killer of women; and

WHEREAS, according to the Government of Guam, Department of Public Health and Social Services - Office of Vital Statistics, of the top ten (10) causes of death on Guam in 2014, heart disease ranked as the number one (1) cause of death, accounting for 31.10% of all deaths on Guam; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Heart Association, the five (5) cardiovascular measurement numbers all women should know in order to take control of their heart health are that of Total Cholesterol, High-Density Lipoprotein (HDL) Cholesterol, Blood Pressure, Blood Sugar and Body Mass Index (BMI); and

WHEREAS, according to the American Heart Association, knowing these numbers can help women and their health care providers determine whether there is a risk for developing cardiovascular diseases. It is significant for all women to learn these critical numbers in their life because their hearts depend on it; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Heart Association, eighty percent (80%) of cardiac events may be prevented through education and lifestyle changes; and

WHEREAS, on Guam, several individuals and organizations have joined together in support of the "Go Red for Women" movement, and will be participating in the promotion of a "Go Red, Get FIT Guam" healthy lifestyle campaign that brings knowledge to potentially save a life from cardiovascular disease; and

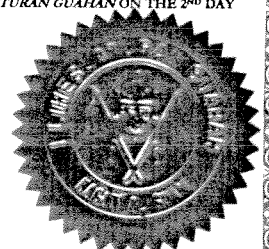




