BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA TRENTAI KUATTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, fifty (50) years ago, on June 1, 1968, fifty-six (56) bright and motivated young men graduated from Father Dueñas Memorial School (FDMS) under the leadership of then-Principal, Father George Maddock, O.F.M. Cap., of the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin; with the intellectual and spiritual nourishment from FDMS faculty members; †Father Antonine Zimmermann, O.F.M. Cap., †Father Knute Kenlon, O.F.M. Cap., †Father Peter McCall, O.F.M. Cap., †Father Donan Hickory, O.F.M. Cap., †Father Robert Phelps, O.F.M. Cap., †Father Manuel Cruz, †Father Thomas Camacho, Mr. John Forbes, †Mr. Paul Hatton, and Ms. Dolores Garcia; and with the representation and advocacy of FDMS Senior Council Members: Class President, Vince Dueñas; Class Vice President, †Fred Castro; Class Secretary, Pascual Artero; and Class Representatives, Ben Pablo and Mike Cruz; and

WHEREAS, the members of the FDMS Class of 1968 experienced their high school years in an era of great hardship. On the one hand, there were empowering movements for social change and justice taking place on the world stage with the Civil Rights Movement, the Voting Rights Act of 1965, and the movement for world peace. On the other hand, here, at home in Guam, families, and especially mothers, were confronted with the harsh reality of losing their sons and brothers as casualties of war, or being separated from them after high school graduation due to being drafted to serve in the Vietnam War, or those who were patriotic and volunteered for military service. Many will also recall that this period was heightened emotionally because the everyday landscape was filled with B-52 Bombers flying overhead, trucks carrying bombs and weapons down the main roads, and excess bombs piled along the sides of the roads; and

WHEREAS, locally, the political landscape was shifting with the passing of the Guam Elective Governor Act of 1968, after years of struggle for self-governance, which led to the first election of Guam's Governor and Lieutenant Governor by the people of Guam on November 3, 1970; and

WHEREAS, the members of FDMS Class of 1968 exemplified the Mission & Vision of their Alma Mater as Guam's most prestigious all-male high school for students pursuing college-preparatory programs that provided a well-rounded education of the mind, heart, and spirit; and

WHEREAS, upon graduation, the members of FDMS Class of 1968 set out into the world to attain professional degrees of higher education and technological training, to become practitioners of law, medicine, and architecture, and successful business owners; to serve as senior officers and senior enlisted Non-Commissioned Officers in the United States military; and to hold senior supervisory positions, and specialized licenses in their fields and careers in all sectors of society that would allow them to contribute to their island community and the larger world community. They not only accomplished what they set out to achieve, but also set the bar in many of their chosen fields of expertise; and

WHEREAS, the members of the FDMS Class of 1968 integrated the mind, heart, and spirit approach to knowledge into all aspects of life. They raised their families with the values cherished by the island community; they struggled to create a better future for their island community, themselves, and their children; and thus, they worked tirelessly to contribute significantly to the overall social, cultural, political, religious, and economic health and advancements of the island of Guam; and

WHEREAS, out of a sense of duty to uphold the FDMS tradition of excellence and generosity, the FDMS Class of 1968 has supported future generations of FDMS Friars by raising funds for scholarships, donating a class gift of a stained-glass window to improve the school's Boys Chapel, and accomplishing several fundraising activities to help build the FDMS Phoenix Center, amongst other school improvements; and

WHEREAS, several members of the FDMS Class of 1968 volunteered their time to form a planning committee for the FDMS Fiftieth (50th) Class Reunion, with the goal of creating a festive and successful event, fostering a sense of loyalty and fraternity among the 1968 graduates of FDMS, and promoting the general welfare of classmates and support for the high school, which is located in Mangilao, Guam; and

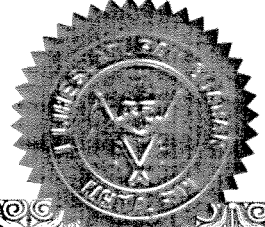




