WHEREAS, since its founding, UOG has conferred over seventeen thousand five hundred (17,500) degrees to students who went on to serve as the foundation of our island and region's professional workforce, and who strengthen our economy as they establish themselves in businesses and in the community as accountants, scientists, nurses, teachers, entrepreneurs, social workers, and many other specialties; and

WHEREAS, UOG alumni maintain a strong, vibrant presence in all sectors of our community, and they play a major role in the political, economic, and social development of our region; and

WHEREAS, as the only four (4)-year, U.S. accredited, land-grant institution in the Western Pacific, UOG is a public comprehensive university offering fifteen (15) master degree programs and twenty-five (25) bachelor degree programs; and

WHEREAS, UOG achieved its second consecutive eight (8)-year accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC) in 2016, as well as program-specific accreditation from the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, Inc. for the Nursing program; the Council on Social Work Education for the Social Work program; the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation for the Education programs; and the International Assembly for Collegiate Business Education for the Business Administration programs; and


