BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAL KUATTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, for over 25 years, Roselie has been a vested community member who chose to make Guam home and intends to remain for life because of the opportunities to create healthier communities through the Department of Public Health & Social Services (DPHSS). She is a staunch Social Work advocate volunteering selflessly to provide professional counseling services to families and individuals. She has a consistent lifetime Public Health commitment serving Guam, especially the under-served and under-represented communities and strongly believes in community-based organization partnerships; and

WHEREAS, Roselie steadfastly advances and researches initiatives benefiting community health that may be unpopular or misunderstood. She supported policies that were met with resistance such as the *Tobacco 21 Bill* that raised the legal smoking age to 21 years and breastfeeding rights advocacy through the *Nana Yan Patgon Act*. She risked resistance by opponents; however, these policies have now become proven health cornerstones; and

WHEREAS, despite a life-threatening disease, Roselie inspires by example and maintains contact with DPHSS staff while temporarily being away from Guam for necessary lifesaving treatment. This exceptionally difficult achievement is accomplished through her fervent resolve to overcome adversity; and

WHEREAS, since 1998, she made the annual *Hemophilia Camp Hafa Adai* happen for families with bleeding disorders such as hemophilia and Von Willebrand Disease (VWD) which are largely unknown on Guam. Medical services are severely limited. Zabala works beyond expectations by providing an educational and empowering annual camp for families with bleeding disorders; and WHEREAS, in 2002, Zabala established the DPHSS Bureau of Community Health Services (BCHS) and now manages cancer, diabetes, tobacco prevention, sexual violence prevention, cultural competency, surveillance and Medical Social Services (MSS) programs. BCHS is globally recognized for excellence under her leadership. In 2010, she brought prominence to the Guam Non-Communicable Disease (NCD) Consortium; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, the Consortium gained respect from global health organizations because of her vision of researching and addressing chronic diseases above and beyond existing benchmarks. She extracts community talents and skills to sustain the Consortium; and

WHEREAS, her lifetime achievements continually benefit Guam's underserved and under-represented communities, including marginalized and forgotten populations. Zabala's applied Social Work practice also benefits those experiencing widening racial and ethnic health disparities on Guam; and

WHEREAS, Zabala unifies teamwork, leadership and uncompromising ethics that create healthy communities. She espouses balanced living, cultural appreciation, quality workplace performance, individual health maintenance and the absolute importance of strengthening family and community; and

WHEREAS, Zabala's lifetime Social Work achievements are well above and beyond reasonable expectations from even the extraordinary among us. She exemplifies the very best of all that is good and right with Guam and is truly deserving of this award; now therefore be it
