Agnes had wanted to go back to school to finish her formal education after the war, but her father passed away on September 2, 1944, two (2) months after the Liberation, while resettling the family; and so her mother became employed to support the family; and Agnes, being the eldest child, was tasked to stay home and help raise and care for her younger siblings, and so she had to forego her education once again.
