# 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI KUÅTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

WHEREAS, during the War in Vietnam, the people of Guam provided over six
thousand (6,000) of her finest men in the Armed Forces of the United States, the

preponderance either were drafted or enlisted in the United States Army. Seventy-seven
 (77) were killed and many wounded, physically and emotionally, becoming casualties
 of the war; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Enrique C. Cruz is from Guam and would be
classified as Native American Pacific Islander who served with Troop B, 1<sup>st</sup> Squadron,
4<sup>th</sup> Cavalry, 1<sup>st</sup> Infantry Division, US Army, and was awarded the Distinguished Service
Cross on October 6, 1966 (Headquarters, U. S. Army, Vietnam, General Orders No.
5937). His citation follows:

9 "The President of the United States of America, authorized by Act of Congress, July 9, 1918 (amended by act of July 25, 1963), takes pleasure in presenting the 10 Distinguished Service Cross to Staff Sergeant Enrique C. Cruz (ASN: RA-11 50010125), United States Army, for extraordinary heroism in connection with 12 13 military operations involving conflict with an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam, while serving with Troop B, 1st Squadron, 4th Cavalry, 1st Infantry 14 Division. On 30 June 1966, Staff Sergeant Cruz was serving as a track 15 commander of the last vehicle in a column movement during a search and destroy 16 mission along Highway 13. When his unit received intense hostile fire from a 17 Viet Cong Regiment, Staff Sergeant Cruz observed that the insurgents were 18 closing in from the rear in an attempt to cut off the column. He immediately 19 swung his track around and delivered suppressive fire onto the attacking Viet 20 Cong. For more than an hour, he prevented the insurgent force from breaching 21 22 the rear of the column. When a nearby tank was hit by hostile fire which killed the tank commander and wounded the three crew members, Staff Sergeant Cruz, 23 with complete disregard for his safety, rushed to the burning tank, pulled out all 24 three stricken crewmen, and carried them to the cover of his armored personnel 25 carrier. He then administered first aid to his wounded comrades and took them to 26

the evacuation area. Although he was wounded while pulling the wounded 1 soldiers from the vehicle, Staff Sergeant Cruz refused to be evacuated. Instead, 2 he resupplied his carrier with ammunition and returned to the front of the battle 3 area to provide covering fire for the evacuation of the wounded. When his 4 machine gun barrel melted due to the intense rate of fire, he jumped from his tank 5 and secured another weapon from a disabled carrier. He refused to be evacuated 6 when wounded a second time. When the Viet Cong fire subsided, Staff Sergeant 7 Cruz maneuvered his vehicle to the rear and evacuated his wounded comrades. 8 He then re-supplied his track with ammunition, returned to the battle area, and 9 remained there until the end of the engagement. Staff Sergeant Cruz's 10 extraordinary heroism and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest 11 traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his, unit, 12 13 and the United States Army."

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Enrique C. Cruz, in a valiant act of heroism, 14 delivered suppressive fire for over an hour against the attacking Viet Cong in an attempt 15 to cut off and breach the unit. He personally pulled out three (3) wounded crewmen 16 from their burning tank, thus saving their lives. When he was wounded, he refused 17 evacuation and remained in the area until the end of the engagement. Through his 18 extraordinary initiative, outstanding leadership acumen, and inspiring valor above and 19 beyond the call of duty in the face of almost certain death, he saved several of his 20 comrades from serious injury and possible death. His conspicuous gallantry and 21 intrepidity at the risk of his life were above and beyond the call of duty and upheld the 22 highest traditions of the United States Army; and 23

WHEREAS, the National Defense Authorization Act 2017 (Public Law 114-328) directs the Secretary of each military department to conduct a review of the service records of certain eligible veterans of the Korean and Vietnam Wars who are of Asian American or Native American Pacific Island descent and were previously awarded the
 Distinguished Service Cross, the Navy Cross, or the Air Force Cross. In those cases
 where the Secretary concerned determines that the service records of those veterans
 support the award of the Medal of Honor, the NDAA 2017 waives the statutory time
 limitation for award of the Medal; and

WHEREAS, the Native American Pacific Programs, Act 1974 (42 U.S.C.
§2992c(6)) defines Native American Pacific Islander as an individual who is indigenous
to a U.S. Territory or possession in the Pacific Ocean and includes such individuals
while residing in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Enrique C. Cruz meets the prerequisites in the
 NDAA 2017 and the Native American Pacific Program Act for expedited review and
 consideration for the Medal of Honor award; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'trentai Kuåttro Na 13 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people 14 of Guam, express posthumously the gratitude of the people of Guam and the I 15 Liheslaturan Guåhan for the unselfish valorous and heroic act of Staff Sergeant Enrique 16 17 C. Cruz, United States Army, during the War in Vietnam; does further recognize him posthumously for his professionalism, honor, courage, integrity, commitment, and 18 unselfish service to the United States of America and the Island of Guam; does further 19 honor him posthumously for having been awarded the Distinguished Service Cross; and 20 does further anticipate expeditious consideration of Staff Sergeant Enrique C. Cruz for 21 the Medal of Honor pursuant to the NDAA 2017; and be it further 22

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the family of the late Staff Sergeant Enrique C. Cruz; to the U.S. Army Human Resources Command; to the Secretary of the U.S.

- 1 Army; to all members of the U.S. House of Representative Armed Services Committee
- 2 and all members of the U.S. Senate Committee on Armed Services; to the Honorable
- 3 Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Member of Congress, U.S. House of Representatives; and to
