She has nine (9) siblings and had to take on the responsibility to help her family survive. Her parents were very resourceful. Her father, knew how to live by the land he hunted, farmed, and fished to help provide for his family. Her mother was also very capable of caring her family during the occupation. She was not only a homemaker, she was also a seamstress who could transform any type of fabric into clothing. She made soap and candles from coconut oil and did anything possible to ensure her family had their needs. During this time of despair, Mrs. Garrido's family was determined to survive the occupation; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Garrido was forced to work on the rice fields during the war. She had to carry her younger sister on her back to the fields because anyone who couldn't work or didn't obey demands faced harsh punishment and even death by the Japanese. Mrs. Garrido witnessed and experienced the atrocities of war and has shared her memories with her family; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Garrido cared for her family wholeheartedly and never faltered in her determination to complete her academics. She hoped to complete her schooling and become a teacher, but because of the war and the high costs to commute to Mangilao where the high school was, she was unable to fulfill her dreams; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Garrido, has lived an enriching life, she did all she could to earn a living from ironing boxes of laundry for military families after the war to farming, shrimping, and virtually anything to build on her individual successes. She is married and has raised children of her own and has always been blessed with love and joy throughout her life. She is known as "Mum'pai" to her grandchildren and is loving and humorous, and through her wartime experiences they appreciate her strength and commitment to her family; and

WHEREAS, an effort recognize and appreciate Guam's survivors of war, Guam honorary high school diplomas have been given to individuals who have not been able to earn a high school diploma because of the Japanese occupation of Guam. Mrs. Garrido has been bestowed an honorary high school diploma and has been able to realize her dream of completing her studies. 
