

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I 2 MINA'TRENTAI KUATRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

WHEREAS, Master Sergeant (MSgt.) Nicholas N. San Nicolas celebrates his accomplishments with his wife, Nicole and their three wonderful children: Kianni,

5 Dominick, and Malakai; and

6 WHEREAS, MSgt. San Nicolas graduated from boot camp at Parris Island, SC

on October 17, 1997, after graduating from MCT and MOS school at Fort Sill,

8 Oklahoma. He received orders to 1st Marine Division Camp Pendleton, CA. He was

deployed with Battalion Landing Team 1/4, 15th Marine Expedition Unit in December

10 1998 as a Cannoneer, Artilleryman and participated in Operation Maritime Intercept,

1 WHEREAS, in 1999, he was promoted to the rank of Corporal and later to the rank of Sergeant in September 2001. In November 2001, he participated in Operation 2 Enduring Freedom, Afghanistan where he served as an artillery cannoneer section chief; 3 4 and 5 WHEREAS, in March 2003, MSgt. San Nicolas served in Combat during Operation Iraqi Freedom earning himself the Combat Action Ribbon. He was hand 6 selected to Instruct at the Artillery Training School, Camp Pendleton to instruct basic 7 8 cannoneer and basic machine gun course. He then became the Curriculum Developer 9 and earning the billet as Chief Instructor; and 10 WHEREAS, on April 1, 2005, MSgt. San Nicolas was promoted to the rank of 11 Staff Sergeant. He graduated Career Course at Camp Pendleton in December 2005. In December 2005, he received orders to Recruiter School, MCRD, San Diego. He would 12 13 serve a successful tour as a recruiter and hand selected to fill in the pool program 14 specialist billet where he would earn the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal; and 15 WHEREAS, in 2008, he received orders to Camp Pendleton, CA. where he 16 17 would excel to become the Battery Local Security Chief. In August 2010, he earned the promotion to Gunnery Sergeant. He then graduated from the Enlisted University 18 Advance Course West Coast; and 19 20 WHEREAS, from January 2012 to May 2013, MSgt. San Nicolas served as the Battalion Field Artillery Chief for 1st Battalion, 11th Marines, Camp Las Pulgas. On 21 22 September 1, 2015, with hard work and dedication, he was promoted to his current rank where he was serving as the Operations Chief for Marine Corps Recruit Depot San 23

Diego Headquarters Service Battalion. During this time, he received orders to Marine

Corps Activity Guam serving as the Senior Enlisted Advisor; and

WHEREAS, from June 2017 to June 2018, MSgt. San Nicolas' performance throughout his tour of duty at Marine Corps Activity Guam was noted by a high degree of professionalism, compassion, and loyal devotion to duty. As the first Chamorro Senior Enlisted Advisor for the unit, his work has been essential to building significant relationships in the community between U.S. Marines and the great people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, his involvement within the local community consisted of established relationships with many of Guam's Mayors and staffs; organizing a village park sustainment program in Dededo; working with various Mayors in support of the annual Liberation Festivities and Parade; coordinating Marine Corps support for numerous memorials and ceremonies commemorating the sacrifices of the people of Guam during the Japanese occupation; coordinating the 2016 & 2017 Marine Corps ball ceremonies which included influential leaders from the community; and

WHEREAS, capitalizing on the Marine Corps' rich history on Guam, MSgt. San Nicolas spearheaded the Mayor's Council of Guam community outreach to reinvigorate existing community support for the buildup and to gain new support from non-governmental organizations, local businesses and Guam's department of the National Park Service; to educate service members coming to the island; assisted in refurbishing the McCool Elementary School Pacific War Memorial located on the original Marine Corps Barracks; coordinated planning & supervised logistics for numerous civil-military ceremonies on and off base, five Color Guard events and supervised the practice & proper execution of five funerals on the island; and

WHEREAS, Master Sergeant San Nicolas' drive was effective in cultivating the Marines about Guam and its important cultural heritage. His innovative solutions and commitment to hard work has made an impact on the unit and community since his time

on island.
