In June 1990, pursuant to Public Law 20-159, Catholic Social Service, in partnership and with funding support from the Bureau of Social Services Administration, Department of Public Health and Social Services, formally established the *Guma' San Jose* (House of Saint Joseph) Homeless Shelter to address the growing number of homeless people in our island community; and

**WHEREAS**, *Guma' San Jose* provides various services, such as a twenty-four (24)-hour emergency shelter for up to sixty (60) days for families or individuals who are homeless or living in a place not fit for human habitation; and walk-in services for food, clothing, laundry, hygiene, and extensive caseworker support to help families and individuals get back on their feet; and

**WHEREAS**, the demand for emergency shelter in our island community continues to grow, and presents a daily challenge to the *Guma' San Jose* Homeless Shelter, which is consistently at capacity, with a waiting list of between sixty (60) to eighty (80) families and individuals seeking shelter and services; and

**WHEREAS**, the hardworking caseworkers of *Guma' San Jose* try their best to meet daily demands by focusing on helping families and individuals gain access to public assistance, housing, employment, and transportation to appointments; and they also provide workshops that include the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) to help clients learn how to stretch their food dollars; as well as providing workshops on fire safety and prevention, parenting, financial literacy for managing income and budgeting, literacy programs, and community outreach to our island's homeless population; and

**WHEREAS**, the staff and management of *Guma' San Jose* work diligently to fulfill the daily demand and vision of Catholic Social Service to enable individuals to develop to their best potential; to develop a comprehensive range of human services; to promote social justice and to work to effect change; to assist the poor, disadvantaged, and marginalized; to affirm cultural diversity and collaborative efforts to promote relationships in keeping with Christian ideals; and to advocate for environmental protection among all the islands of the Marianas and Micronesia; and

**WHEREAS**, the generosity and volunteerism of various individuals, groups, organizations, and benefactors play a critical role in helping *Guma' San Jose* sustain its daily operations and achieve its mission, for which they are wholeheartedly grateful for, which include the Bank of Guam, St. Paul's School, Santa Barbara Church and Catholic School, Andersen Air Force Base (AAFB) Finlisted Spouses, *Guanbau* Lions Club, Guam Young Professionals, Guam Masons, Naval Station Guam 2<sup>nd</sup> Class Petty Officers Association, Fil-Am Organization, Guam Association of Realtors, Guam Girl Scouts, Foody's - Shell Guam, Pangasinan Filipino Association, Guam Spirit Lions Club, *Pala Mike* Crisostomo, the Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish, the Santa Teresita Parish, Santa Teresita Knights of Columbus and parish organizations, and countless others; and

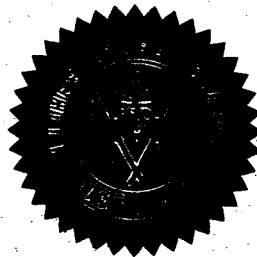




