WHEREAS, Lon is survived by his loving wife of forty (40) years, Kim; their children, Daniel and Carol; and their grandchildren, Lonnie, Jonathan, and Hannah; and

WHEREAS, Lon had taught at Wesleyan College in Mitchell, South Dakota, and at a Junior College in Longmont, Colorado before moving to Guam in 1970 to serve as an off-island contract science teacher; and

WHEREAS, Lon taught biology at John F. Kennedy High School in Tamuning for two (2) years. He also served as a mentor for the federally-funded Guam Teacher Corps to train science teachers in 1974; and, he served as former Deputy Director of the Guam Teacher Center; and

WHEREAS, Lon also taught biology, math, and chemistry at the Guam Community College (GCC), and retired from GCC as a full professor in 1988; and, he had also served as a President of the Guam Federation of Teachers for many years; and

WHEREAS, Lon was the proprietor of K&L Driving School, which opened in the 1980s, and was the first private driving school to serve the community of Guam and was in operation for more than thirty-five (35) years. He also owned Reliable Car Rental and Pacific Solar & Steel System; and, he was a lifetime member of the American Legion, Post 246, and was a Mason; and

WHEREAS, Lon was proactive in education, and he advocated, lobbied, and worked alongside Guam senators and former governors to improve public education; and

WHEREAS, while residing on Guam, Lon continued serving in the military with the Coast Guard Reserve, Guam and the Guam Air National Guard; and, he retired in March 1995 after serving for twenty-four (24) years; and

WHEREAS, Lon fell in love with Guam's beauty, ocean, weather, and its multi-cultural make-up, and most of all, the warm hospitality of the people of Guam. He chose Guam as his home for the past forty-seven (47) years; and, he will be fondly remembered for his vibrant energy, warm personality, and good sense of humor; now therefore, be it

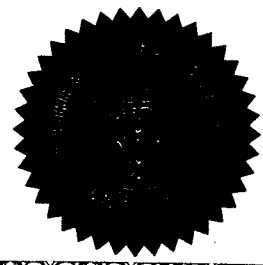
