- WHEREAS, from 1986 to 1989, Captain Susuico served the nation as Platoon
- 7 Leader, Scout Platoon Leader, and Support Platoon and Dining Facility Officer in the
- 8 Fourth (4th) Battalion, Twenty-Third (23rd) Infantry Regiment (Motorized) at Fort
- 9 Lewis, Washington; and
- 10 WHEREAS, after completing the Infantry Officer Advanced Course, from
- 11 October 1990 to May 1992, Captain Susuico was assigned to Schofield Barracks,
- Hawaii, where he served as an Assistant S-3, Third (3rd) Brigade, Twenty-Fifth (25th)
- 13 Infantry (Light); and
- 14 WHEREAS, Captain Susuico further served as Operations Officer, from
- 15 August 1992 to July 1993, and was assigned to the United States Army Central
- 16 Command, ARCENT Training and Security-Kuwait; and
- 17 WHEREAS, in September 1993, Captain Susuico returned to Guam and
- 18 carried the torch of his predecessors as an Assistant Professor of Military Science at
- 19 the University of Guam Army Senior ROTC (also known as the Triton Warrior

- 21 Warrior Battalion has been instrumental in forming quality college students into
- 22 Second Lieutenants for the U.S. Army; and
- WHEREAS, Captain Susuico is a decorated and recognized member of the
- 24 U.S. Armed Forces, having received numerous awards and commendations which
- 25 include: the Meritorious Service Award; the National Defense Medal with one (1) Oak
- 26 Leaf Cluster; the Army Good Conduct Medal; the Army Commendation Medal with

- 1 One (1) Oak Leaf Cluster; the Southwest Asia Soldiers Medal with two (2) Bronze
- 2 Stars; the Humanitarian Service Ribbon; the Overseas Service Ribbon; the
- 3 Multinational Force and Observes Medal; the Saudi Arabia Medal; the Kuwait
- 4 Liberation Medal; the Parachutist Badge; the Ranger Tab; and the Expert Infantryman
- 5 Badge; and
- 6 WHEREAS, after twenty-one (21) years of active military duty, Captain
- 7 Susuico honorably retired from the United States Army in October of 1996; and
- WHEREAS, in December 1996, Captain Susuico began his work in enhancing
- 9 the lives of thousands of young, motivated students in his tenure as Senior Army
- 10 Instructor for the Simon Sanchez High School JROTC Program with the Guam
- 11 Department of Education; and
