1 BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTAI KUÅTTRO NA* 2 *LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

WHEREAS, Raymond Arceo San Nicolas has dedicated thirty-five (35) years
of service to the government of Guam, working at the Guam Fire Department (GFD).
He is the son of +Vicente T. and +Juana A. San Nicolas, and one of eleven (11)
children. Raymond will be celebrating his retirement with his loving wife of 26 years,
Rosemarie Gogo San Nicolas; their three children, Raena Jo, Roseanne, and Ray
Vicente; and their two beautiful grandchildren, Hadrian Ray and Olivia Rosemaria;

9 WHEREAS, Raymond was born and raised in the village of *Ordot*, where he
10 continues to live with Rosemarie and their family;

WHEREAS, upon the encouragement and advice of his parents, Raymond enrolled in the Fire Service in May 1989, with the 11th Fire Cycle. He graduated in October that year, and began working at Station 1, the Tamuning Fire Station, where he would work for the next two years;

1 WHEREAS, Raymond was assigned to the GFD's Search and Rescue Unit in 2 1991, where we would work faithfully for the next sixteen (16) years, rotating 3 assignments throughout the island (with Rescues 1, 2, 3, and 4) and performing 4 countless missions in that time;

5 WHEREAS, while working for Search and Rescue, Raymond performed 6 several successful life-saving missions, but also witnessed firsthand the tragedy of 7 lives lost, including those of young people and children;

8 WHEREAS, Raymond's search and rescue missions include but are not limited 9 to land searches in treacherous jungles and other rough inland terrain; water rescues in 10 inclement weather, involving diving in rough waters, using jet skis, and driving rescue 11 boats to save distressed swimmers and help other seriously injured persons; and, on 12 occasion, the recovery of the bodies of individuals who died in tragic circumstances;

WHEREAS, Raymond and his fellow firemen, never knowing when emergencies would arise, would often leave their homes and families in the dead of night to respond to them, often not knowing what would be required until they arrived on the scene, engaging in split-second decision-making to mitigate dangerous situations and save lives;

18 WHEREAS, while assigned to Search and Rescue, Raymond was awarded the 19 GFD's second highest award, the Silver Star Award, for his quick thinking and 20 survival skills (acquired from his service with the U.S. Army's 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Unit), 21 which resulted in saving a local teenager who had fallen and was trapped in a hole 22 deep in the *Talofofo* jungles. Raymond and his co-workers were able to retrieve the 23 boy, who sustained only minor injuries from the fall;

WHEREAS, the most significant of all search and rescue missions occurred in the early morning hours of August 6, 1997, with the crash of Korean Airlines Flight No. 801. Raymond, who was working with Rescue Unit 3 in Agat at the time, was one of the first responders on the scene. He vividly recalls trailing through the deep *sakåti*,
 struggling to make his way to the crash site to find, and hopefully save, any survivors.
 Sadly, most of the 256 passengers aboard that flight, including many young children,
 did not make it;

5 WHEREAS, throughout Raymond's career with the GFD, he has held other 6 positions in other units such as the Suppression Unit, where he spent five (5) years 7 fighting grassfires in the southern end of Guam, and the Fire Prevention Unit, where 8 he served as a Fire Inspector and a nationally registered EMT. According to 9 Raymond, the most rewarding thing about his work as a fireman has been the ability 10 to serve others, especially in their time of need; now therefore, be it
