BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI KUATTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, it is the custom of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to recognize those remarkable organizations of this great island whose focus and intent have made a substantial impact on the quality of life in our communities; to commend those organizations that distinguish themselves through outstanding professionalism, profound compassion, and enduring commitment to the community they serve; and to recognize the collective achievements of those dedicated individuals who have substantially contributed to the welfare of our island community and its residents; and

WHEREAS, Sanctuary, Incorporated was established in 1971 by Capuchin Friar Father Robert Phelps, OFM Cap; and founding Executive Director Mr. Luis Martinez, to create a safe and temporary alternative to correctional detention for Guam's troubled youth. Sanctuary, Inc. has since expanded its mission, facility, and its programs as a community-based organization that exists to improve the quality of life for the island's youth, to promote reconciliation during times of family conflicts, to foster the development of responsible community members, and to advocate for their needs in an effort to preserve family unity by providing a multitude of services; and

WHEREAS, in its tireless efforts to fulfill its mission of "Helping Youth and Families Help Themselves," Sanctuary, Inc. has been providing invaluable assistance to the greater community by remaining at the forefront of delivering services to runaway, homeless, and troubled youth and their families; expanding its programs to better address the needs of our island's children who confront many difficult issues, such as physical and emotional abuse, sexual abuse, gang involvement, negative peer pressure, and substance abuse; and helping to provide a firm foundation that will assist children and youth to be better able to face the challenges of the future; and

WHEREAS, at the crux of the services provided by Sanctuary, Inc. are the four (4) temporary housing programs utilized by one hundred twenty-four (124) clients in Fiscal Year 2018. Eighty-six (86) clients were served by the CO-ED Emergency Shelter in *Chalco Pago*, a temporary housing facility that provides thirty (30) days of respite to children ages twelve (12) to seventeen (17) years who are runaway, homeless or victims of abuse, and is capable of housing up to eighteen (18) children. A total of twenty-one (21) clients were served by *Sagan Na'lonolo* (A Place to Heal) in *Mangilan*, the island's only drug and alcohol residential treatment facility for substance dependent youth ages twelve (12) to seventeen (17) years. Fondly called the "Lajan House" since its donation by Attorney David Lajan in the mid-1990s, this facility provides a three (3) to six (6) month residential program that implements an evidence-based Matrix Model curriculum encompassing five (5) phases of treatment (Orientation, Awareness, Enhancement, Enlightenment, and Empowerment). As clients live in a therapeutic community, youth and families participate in counseling services related to substance use and abuse, relapse prevention, emotional wellness, and adolescent education; and five (5) clients were served by the Permanent Housing Program (PHP), which can accommodate up to four (4) homeless youth between the ages of eighteen (18) and twenty-four (24) years, helping them work towards independent living and self-sufficiency by providing shelter, supportive counseling, and life-skills instruction; and twelve (12) clients were served at the *Sagan Lando* (A Place for a Better Life) Transitional Living Program, which can accommodate up to six (6) youth, including pregnant or parenting youth, ages sixteen (16) to twenty-two (22), with up to three (3) dependents, ages zero (0) to three (3); and

WHEREAS, as the first human services organization in the Pacific region to receive full accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) International in 2008, Sanctuary, Inc. has since maintained its accreditation from CARF International and was awarded the maximum number of years - a three (3) year accreditation, on June 26, 2017. Accreditation by CARF International signifies that in the child and youth services field, Sanctuary, Inc. has met annual conformance requirements in over one hundred twenty-five (125) quality standards that enhance the lives of the children and families that Sanctuary, Inc. serves. The intensive survey of Sanctuary, Inc.'s administration and programs took place on May 17-19, 2017, with CARF Administrative Surveyor, John Page, ACSW, LAPSWS and Program Surveyor, Conny Anderson, Ph.D. visiting the organization. The 2017 accreditation is an indication of Sanctuary's dedication to delivering quality service and marks Sanctuary, Inc.'s fourth (4th) accreditation survey; and

WHEREAS, after four (4) years of not receiving any federal funding sources, Sanctuary, Inc. was successful in acquiring two (2) federal grants, to include the *Sagan I Jukola* (A Place for A Better Life) Transitional Living Program which was received in Fiscal Year 2017 by the Family and Youth Services Bureau (FYSB) under the Administration for Children and Families (ACF), and implemented in early Fiscal Year 2018, whose mission is to promote safety, stability, and well-being for people who have experienced or been exposed to violence, neglect or trauma; and the *Isula Mawleh* (To Make Right) Summer/After-school Cultural Program from the Administration for Native Americans (ANA) grant, which aims to build resiliency among youth through traditional teachings; and

WHEREAS, in line with its community development efforts, Sanctuary, Inc. is also host to the largest AmeriCorps program on Guam with eighty (80) members. *Hynda Para I Komunidad* (Help for the Community) provides its members with enrichment activities and opportunities to assist and mentor youth at the Sanctuary, Inc. shelters, as well as at three (3) Department of Youth Affairs resource centers and a number of Guam Department of Education (GDOE) middle schools; and, they co-facilitate Sanctuary, Inc. support groups, attend various conferences and workshops, and receive training in community emergency response, first aid, and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR); and

WHEREAS, Sanctuary, Inc. has served four hundred forty-two (442) clients in Fiscal Year 2018 and continues to strive to implement programs, initiatives, and services to assist youth and families, to include: three (3) shelters; a range of psycho-educational classes and groups, including two (2) levels of outpatient drug and alcohol classes, and specialized support groups for parenting skills, and adult and youth anger management; a twenty-four (24)-hour crisis hotline; HIV/STD testing and education; client advocacy; case management services; tobacco cessation courses; and aftercare services; and

WHEREAS, receiving an outpouring of support from individuals, private businesses, and the general public over the last forty-seven (47) years, Sanctuary, Inc. is an indisputable partner of the community, and is made up of a diverse group of individuals who are passionate and committed to helping youth and their families. Its Board of Directors is comprised of Chairperson Mrs. Rindray Linao, Vice Chairperson Ms. Marilyn Bonta, Treasurer Mrs. Maria Leon Guerrero, Secretary Dr. Kristi Anna Santos, and Members *Dr. Mike Crisostomo*, Ms. Guadalupe Guzman, Mrs. Jackie Perez, Attorney Ray Haddock, Mr. Shane Moore, and Mr. Javan Santos. Ms. Theresa C. Arriala currently serves as the organization's Executive Director who heads a staff of forty-five (45) dedicated individuals; and

WHEREAS, Sanctuary, Incorporated is an organization whose focus and intent have made a substantial positive contribution to the welfare of our island community and who have distinguished themselves through outstanding professionalism, profound compassion, and enduring commitment to the youth and families they serve; and

WHEREAS, a true asset to society, Sanctuary, Inc. has served thousands of clients since its founding who have benefited from its outreach, prevention, and rehabilitation programs yearly; and, Sanctuary, Inc. continues its efforts to increase awareness about the programs and services it offers by encouraging island residents to join in various events that are held throughout the month of November 2018; and

WHEREAS, it is the sense of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* that when organizations of such noble aims and accomplishments, and tremendous impact to society, are brought to its attention, they should be celebrated and recognized by all the residents of this great island, now therefore, be it

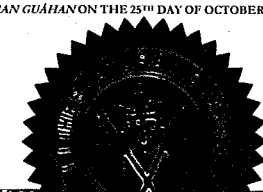

MEMORANDUM
