WHEREAS, Eligio G. Casil, more passionately known at ‘Leo’, graduated from Tumon Junior/Senior High School, now known as John F. Kennedy High School in 1963; and

WHEREAS, Leo obtained a Bachelor’s Degree in Business Administration from the University of Portland, Oregon in 1968; and

WHEREAS, Leo’s contributions to the government began under Guam’s first elected Governor Carlos G. Camacho’s administration in 1973, through succeeding Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo, and Governor Edward J. B. Calvo’s administration ending in January 2019;and

WHEREAS, Leo’s service in the government of Guam launched on April 1, 1973 as a Survey Statistician at the Department of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, from March 31, 1974 to February 27, 1976, Leo served as a Staff Analyst in the Governor’s Office; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Leo worked in the Bureau of Budget and Management from
2 March 1, 1976 to May 29, 1979 as Analyst IV & V; and

3 **WHEREAS**, Leo was named Deputy Director of the Bureau of Budget and
4 Management Research from May 30, 1979 through January 30, 1981; and

5 **WHEREAS**, on February 2, 1981 through March 3, 1982, Leo was the Special
6 Assistant for Federal Programs in the office of Lt. Governor Eddie Reyes; and

7 **WHEREAS**, Leo took the helm of the Department of Administration as
8 Director on March 4, 1982 and closed out the Bordallo Administration on January 2,
9 1983; and

10 **WHEREAS**, Leo returned to the Executive Branch under Governor Eddie J.B.
11 Calvo's administration on January 26, 2011 as Deputy Director of the Department of
12 Public Health and Social Services; later serving in an Acting Director capacity from
13 February 5, 2018 through May 5, 2018, then returning to Deputy Directorship on May
14 6, 2018 through his retirement on December 10, 2018; and

15 **WHEREAS**, Leo served in other capacities in government, private and non-
16 profit sectors; and

17 **WHEREAS**, from 1976 through 1994, Leo served as a Financial Advisor for
18 many of Guam's citizens; and

19 **WHEREAS**, Leo helped Guam's lone public hospital as Assistant Controller
20 and Acting Controller from 1996-1998; and

21 **WHEREAS**, Leo took on the reins as Fiscal Manager and Acting Controller
22 with Catholic Social Services; and

23 **WHEREAS**, Leo honorably served as a member of the United States Navy
24 from 1969 to 1973, honorably discharged as a Petty Officer 2nd Class, having served
25 in the Vietnam War; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Leo’s contributions and institutional knowledge of the
2 government of Guam will be missed by many of those with whom he worked; and

3 **WHEREAS**, Leo’s loves in his family are to be commended as well for their
4 support and dedication to their husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather;
5 namely: Evelyn G. Casil, his wife; his children: Melissa Casil Chargualaf; Jenny Casil
6 Natalicio & Eric Natalicio; Eleo Gregory Casil & Lori Casil; his grandchildren:
7 Danielle, Andrew & Evette Garrido; Aaron, Erica & Emily Natalicio; Hannah Casil
8 Chargualf; and Eli Cabreza & Ellie Gene Casil; and his great-grandchildren: Hailee &
9 Amillia Garrido Black and Damien Cabrera Garrido; and
