BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF $I$ MINA'TRENTAI KUATTTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, Vicenta San Nicolas Camacho, the daughter of Maria Quitugua Mariano San Nicolas and Antonio Dydasco San Nicolas, was born in the capital of Hagåtña, Guam on December 22, 1922; and

WHEREAS, as a young woman, Vicenta survived the Japanese occupation of Guam during World War II, and along with her family members, endured the forced march to the Manneggon concentration camp in Yona; and

WHEREAS, while teaching in Guam after the war, Vicenta met a young Chamorro man and U.S. Navy sailor Atanacio Rivera Camacho in 1947, who was the school principal's younger brother, and later relocated to California with Atanacio
after their marriage, where they would make their home and raise their ten children; and

WHEREAS, Vicenta was her children's bond to their motherland as they were children of the Chamorro diaspora community living away from home, and was also the link to their family history and roots in Guam; and

WHEREAS, Vicenta enjoyed sharing stories of her life in Guam and imparting Chamorro traditions that laid the foundation of her family's core values, and while at family gatherings, Vicenta proudly prepared Chamorro dishes including red rice, kelaguen, bistek and finadene; and

WHEREAS, after her husband Atanacio passed away in 1970, Vicenta remained in California to raise their children until they left for college, military service or to start their own families; and

WHEREAS, Vicenta was motivated by the social movements of the 1970s and 80s and earned two Associate of Arts degrees at Laney Peralta Community College, combining her education and Chamorro Catholic values with her passion for social justice; and

WHEREAS, at the age of 94, Vicenta was the beloved mother, grandmother, great grandmother and matriarch of four generations of Camachos in the U.S., including her 10 children, 55 grandchildren and great grandchildren and countless nieces and nephews; and

WHEREAS, Vicenta passed away peacefully at her home in Folsom, California on March 25, 2017, surrounded by her beloved family members; and

WHEREAS, Vicenta is survived by her children Mary, Anthony, Vincent, Barbara, Josephine, Charles, Elizabeth, George, and Raymond, and is also survived by her brothers Silvino, Jose and Alejandro San Nicolas, and is preceded in death by her husband Atanacio Rivera Camacho, their son John, her brothers, Ramon and Luis, her
parents, Maria Mariano and Antonio Dydasco San Nicolas, and her grandchildren "Nacho" Camacho, and Carlos Camacho Jr.; and

WHEREAS, Vicenta is affectionately remembered for her love of travel, her wonderful sense of humor, her kindness, consideration, and respect of others; and

WHEREAS, Vicenta is also known for her acceptance of diversity of all people and her efforts to promote social justice, worker and immigrant rights, and women's equality; and

WHEREAS, Vicenta's family continues to cherish the wonderful memories of her Chamorro spirit and has established the "Vicenta San Nicolas Camacho Legacy Fund" to perpetuate her legacy of love and respect for human dignity; and

WHEREAS, a Catholic mass \& celebration of Vicenta's life is being held on Friday, June 23, 2017 at the Church of the Good Shepherd, in Pittsburg, California; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Kuaittro Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guähan and the people of Guam, remember and honor the life of the late Vicenta San Nicolas Camacho, a Chamorro survivor of World War II; and express sincere appreciation for her family's story, her service to the community, and her individual efforts to foster Chamorro cultural continuity and values while raising her family away from home; and celebrate her life and remember her as a loving matriarch and a strong Chamorro woman; and does further express sincere condolences and appreciation of her life to her family on her passing; and be it further
