WHEREAS, the people of Guam have been celebrating the anniversary of their liberation from the Japanese Occupation seventy-three years (73) ago. During the anniversary we pay our respect and remember the many Chamorros who have perished and survived during the occupation. The annual Manenggon Memorial service event commemorates the liberation of the Manenggon camp but also honors those from other camps and sites throughout the island such as Chaguian, Asinan, Pigo, Fena, Faha, Tinta,

0 As Mateo, Umafit, and Mata; and

WHEREAS, the march to Manenggon was one of the most brutal events that took place at the end of the Japanese occupation of Guam. On July 1944, as the Americans began to prepare for the liberation of the island. Almost all the people of Guam were forced to travel to Manenggon as well as various camps throughout the island; and

WHEREAS, the location where the Chamorro people were ordered to march to was located in a valley area located between the villages of Yona and Talofofo. Thousands of people, from far north in Yigo and as far west from Agat, from infants to the elderly, were forced to march to the Manenggon camp, with as little as the clothes on their backs. Southern villagers were collected mostly at inland campsites near Malojloj and Merizo; and WHEREAS, this arduous march to Manenggon was difficult for many. People were forced to walk through their hunger and restlessness. Some lost their lives during this march. Young children were left to be cared for by their siblings and mothers lost their babies during the march to Manenggon. Brutal beatings took place as victims tried to help eachother or went astray to locate food; at all costs the march to Manenggon had to be completed; and

WHEREAS, fifteen thousand (15,000) marched to Manenggon building camps throughout the site striving to survive, making temporary shelters with just coconut leaves and tree branches. They got their water from the Manenggon river and did their best to forage for food. The Chamorros were not meant to survive in the camp as they were forced to marched there so they may be massacred by the Japanese; and

WHEREAS, the plight of those in Manenggon would soon be over as American patrols reached the outskirts of the Manenggon camps on July 30, 1944, and on July 31, American troops took control of the main camps; and

WHEREAS, the people of Manenggon later made their way to refugee camps in Agat where they were provided food and shelter. They were liberated from the tyranny of the Japanese Occupation however, the experiences they had to endure during the Japanese occupation would live in their memories forever; and

WHEREAS, each year the Manenggon Memorial Foundation, families of survivors, those who have survived the occupation, community leaders and stakeholders join together to remember and honor those who have suffered before Guam was liberated from the Japanese Occupation. Moreover, memorial services are held throughout the various sites where Chamorros lost their lives. Special services are held as well as various events take place to pay respect and remember; and

WHEREAS, the Manenggon Memorial Foundation as well as several organizations and families reserve time in each year to always remember a time in Guam's history where great loss and hardships took place. The foundation has been unwavering in their gracious purpose in educating future generations about Guam's history and ability to survive hardships and atrocities; now, therefore, be it
