1 WHEREAS, Holly M. Rustick has a brother, Jonathan Rustick; a sister, Sarah 2 Rustick; and she is a proud mother of a beautiful daughter, Isabella Joy; and

3 WHEREAS, Holly M. Rustick attended Rose State College in Midwest City, 4 Oklahoma, where she earned an Associates of Arts in Liberal Studies in December of 5 1999; she was awarded a partial scholarship to attend the University of Hawaii, West Oahu, where she earned a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and Anthropology in 6 7 December 2003; and she is a graduate of the University of Kent at Brussels, where she 8 attained a Master's degree in International Political Economy in 2009; and

9 WHEREAS, Holly M. Rustick began her professional career working as an 10 elementary/middle school teacher at American Creativity Academy in Hawally, 11 Kuwait, where she taught from August 2004 to August 2005, and again from August 12 2007 to August 2008; and
