- WHEREAS, school counselors find themselves serving as "Gate-Keepers" to the Individualized Education Programs (IEP), and Student Study Team (SST), as well as consultants to Special Education teachers, especially since the passage of the "Americans with Disabilities Act" (ADA) in 1990. 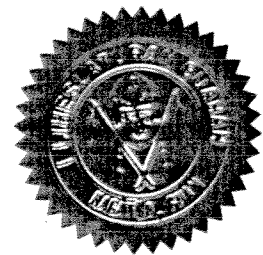
