13 see how much Christ can fill the center of his or her life; and





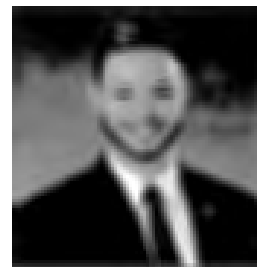
