1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I**
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI KUATTRO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÁHAN:***

3 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine entered the U.S. Navy in
4 September 1998 and attended Basic Training and Basic Electricity, Electronics school
5 and Electronics Technician Class "A" school in Great Lakes, IL; and

6 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine then attended Class "C" schools,
7 AN/WSC-3 at Service School Command Norfolk, VA; and

8 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine received her Associates Degree
9 from University of Maryland University College and is a Senior Enlisted Academy
10 graduate; and

1 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine in her military career, reported
2 to USS SEATTLE (AOE-3) Earle, NJ in 1999, after which she transferred to
3 NCTAMSLANT Norfolk VA 2002; and

4 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine then attended the Extremely
5 High Frequency Radio (AN/USC-38) Combat System Training Command in Norfolk,
6 VA., before reporting back onboard USS SEATTLE (AOE-3) in Norfolk, Va., 2003
7 where she was advanced to Electronics Technician Second Class Petty Officer; and

8 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine , after decommissioning USS
9 SEATTLE, she attended Communications Security (COMSEC) training in Norfolk
10 VA, and reported to NCTAMS LANT Det Hampton Roads Norfolk, VA in 2005 as
11 the Planning Leading Petty Officer (LPO); and

12 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine , upon completion of her tour,
13 she attended Information System Maintenance Technician training at DamNeck, VA
14 and reported to Naval Computer and Telecommunications Station (NCTS) Bahrain in
15 2008, where she was advanced to Electronics Technician First Class Petty Officer and
16 served as OCONUS Navy Enterprise Network (ONE-Net) Tier II Leading Petty
17 Officer; and

18 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine reported onboard USS Theodore
19 Roosevelt (CVN-71) where she served as Combat Systems Communication Divisions
20 CS-8 and CS-9 Leading Petty Officer, while Onboard USS THEODORE
21 ROOSEVELT she was selected for advancement to Chief Petty Officer in 2011 and
22 served as Combat Systems RADAR Division CS-6 Leading Chief Petty Officer; and

1 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine on her next tour had her
2 attending Tactical Air Navigation (TACAN) training enroute to Naval Air Station Key
3 WEST in 2012, where she served as the Ground Electronics Division Leading Chief
4 Petty Officer; and

5 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine , after reporting, she was sent to
6 Maintenance Material Management (3M) school in Norfolk VA and returned to the
7 command and assumed the duties as the 3-M Coordinator as well. During that tour,
8 she was selected for advancement to Senior Chief Petty Officer in 2015.

9 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine then detached NAS Key West
10 and attended Intermediate Level Calibration of Physical/Dimensional Test and
11 Measuring System School in Biloxi, MS. Upon completion of Calibrations school she
12 attended U.S. Navy Senior Enlisted Academy in Newport RI., enroute to USS Franks
13 Cable in Agana, Guam in 2016; and

14 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Blaine currently serves as the Quality Assurance
15 DLCPO, SAPR POC, CPO 365 Phase One Lead; and

16 WHEREAS, Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine received awards to include:
17 Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (2), Navy and Marine Corps
18 Achievement Medal (6), Good Conduct (6), Military Outstanding Volunteer Service
19 Medal, and various unit awards; and

20 **WHEREAS**, the 2017 Guam Joint Women’s Leadership Symposium serves as
21 the premiere training event on Guam dedicated to providing service members
22 professional development through networking, education and mentorship from all five
23 branches of the Armed Forces and is open to all ranks, both men and women serving
24 in the Department of Defense and U. S. Coast Guard – civilians, officers, enlisted and
25 cadets; now therefore, be it

1 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Kuattro Na*
2 *Lihsaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and
3 commend Senior Chief Petty Officer Blaine for being a Guest Speaker at the 2017
4 Joint Women's Leadership Symposium which aims at providing service members
5 professional development through networking, education and mentorship from all five
6 branches of the Armed Forces; and be it further
