- 10 WHEREAS, the founding members include Patricia M. Ehrhart, Betty Pilgrim,
- Bethia C. Sessions, Phyllis H. Tyng, Melba Shriver, Isabel T. Guzman, and Agueda I.

- WHEREAS, for the past sixty-five (65) years the accomplished and dedicated
- 14 members of the Guam Women's Club have given thousands of hours in service and
- 15 fundraising efforts to assist over forty other agencies, organizations, and charities. The

Club has contributed to various civic causes for health, abuse prevention, relief, safety, historic preservation and restoration, the arts, and education; and

WHEREAS, education is one of the Club's paramount concerns. The Club has awarded high school and college scholarships since its inception. The first recipient, Jesusa Cruz San Nicolas, was awarded \$150.00 to attend the Territorial College of Guam now known as the University of Guam. Today, the Club has full time students, Natasha Hagans and Destini Fejeran, attending the University of Guam on a full tuition and fee's scholarship; and

WHEREAS, the Club has also been successful in several community projects such as the establishment of a day care center, village post office branches, and the reestablishment of the Guam Museum, it was instrumental in the legislation that named the Guam Flower, and in the construction of facilities such as the public pool in *Hagatna*, the Latte Stone Park, and the Padre Palomo Park, for which the Club received national recognition. The Club was also involved with the *Lalahita* Park overlooking the village of Umatac and the beautification of *San Ramon* Hill which were made possible through the Club's efforts; and
