WHEREAS, through hard work and dedication, Edward was promoted to the position of Deputy Marshal III in May 1993, to Deputy Marshal Supervisor in September 1995, and to Marshal of the Court in March 2011; and

WHEREAS, Edward was involved with the Firearms Police Review Committee in September 1998, and he was a volunteer for the Thirty-fifth (35th) Guam Special Olympic Track & Field Competition in March 2011; and

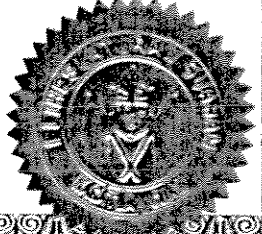
