

WHEREAS, after the events of 9/11, SES Craig B. Whelden was charged to lead the coordination of Hawaii's homeland security efforts with the state's civil authorities, an effort that received national recognition; and

WHEREAS, early in his career, SES Craig B. Whelden served as an Operations and Training Officer (S3/G3) at multiple levels, to include tank battalion, cavalry squadron, armor-heavy brigade, and the mechanized infantry division; and

WHEREAS, SES Craig B. Whelden has served in the ranks from Captain to Brigadier General; and while serving as Colonel, he commanded an Area Support Group in Germany where he was responsible for seven (7) military communities and over forty-five thousand (45,000) soldiers, family members, and other authorized patrons; and

WHEREAS, SES Craig B. Whelden was the first former Garrison Commander in the U.S. Army to be selected for both Brigadier and Major General;

WHEREAS, SES Craig B. Whelden commanded a one thousand (1,000) man combined arms task force, infantry, and field artillery; and he was the Chief of Staff for two (2) of the U.S. Army's ten (10) combat divisions: the 3rd Infantry Division and the 1st Infantry Division; and

WHEREAS, for his eight (8) months of dedication and efforts, SES Craig B. Whelden was personally recognized by the U.S. Secretary of the Army with the two (2) top awards granted to civilian employees: the "Meritorious Civilian Service Award" and the "Decoration for Exceptional Civilian
