

WHEREAS, Dr. Marjorie G. Driver was born in New York in 1924; and she was raised in Puerto Rico, and moved to Guam in 1953; and WHEREAS, Dr. Marjorie G. Driver passed away on September 20, 2019 in Jonestown, Guam; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Marjorie G. Driver taught Spanish and History in Guam high schools for thirteen (13) years, and was a Principal at St. John's School prior to becoming a faculty member and co-founder of the Richard Flores Taitano Micronesian Area Research Center, known as MARC, at the University of Guam (UOG) in 1967; and

WHEREAS, during her professional career, Dr. Marjorie G. Driver was dedicated to scholarly pursuits at UOG, where she served as Director of Translations, Curator, and Research Specialist at the Spanish Document Collection of MARC from 1979 to December 2007; and her work afforded contemporary access to direct historical perspectives by students and scholars specializing in the research and translation of Spanish-language documents; and her efforts and involvement justified a Legislative appropriation of over Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) for MARC and its Spanish Collection; and she was internationally celebrated for her translations of documents from the Spanish colonial period of Guam;

WHEREAS, Dr. Marjorie G. Driver was an active member of several staff and faculty committees at UOG and she contributed to the expansion of the UOG's research staff resources, organization, and archival capacity; and she was recognized by her peers and colleagues at UOG, the Guam Preservation Trust, and the Guam Humanities Council; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Marjorie G. Driver published numerous articles and English translations of historical materials from the Spanish colonial period of Guam, and was an advisor to Guampedia; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Marjorie G. Driver was awarded with an Honorary Doctorate in Human Letters during the 2007 UOG Fall Commencement ceremony for her sustained and significant scholastic and community contributions to the people of Guam and the Pacific region; and she had delivered countless lectures at schools on Guam and throughout the Mariana Islands; now therefore, be it
