WHEREAS, in 1919, Major General William M. Black, United States Army Chief of Engineers, appointed a nine (9)-officer board to consider the formation of an "association of engineers" that would preserve and expand upon connections formed in war, and promote the advancement of engineering and its related professions across government and civil life; and

WHEREAS, in early 1920, the first Society of American Military Engineers (SAME) Posts were founded, providing former colleagues and new associates with opportunities to connect face-to-face, and establishing a network of relationships across the country in support of national security; and in 2020, the Society of American Military Engineers commemorates its Centennial (100th) Anniversary; and

WHEREAS, the Society's headquarters is in Alexandria, Virginia, and it has grown to include some thirty thousand (30,000) members across the United States, and consists of one hundred five (105) Posts, and more than fifty (50) student and field chapters; and

WHEREAS, in 1952, the SAME Guam Post was chartered locally; and in 1959, it awarded its first engineering scholarship; in 1978, the Charlie Corn Golf Tournament was founded on Guam to support future scholarship awards intended for aspiring engineering students, and the scholarship has become the longest-running golf tournament that supports engineering scholarships in the region; and

WHEREAS, the Society's Guam Post has two hundred eighty-seven (287) members in Guam's public, private, military, and academic sectors, and forty-three (43) member organizations in the architecture, engineering, construction, and business industries; and the Society has also supported the Philippine Field Chapter and a student chapter at the University of Guam since 2016, while supporting the establishment of UOG's four (4)-year engineering degree program; and the SAME Guam Post then started a full-day STEM camp in 2017 with over two hundred fifty (250) middle school students in attendance; and

WHEREAS, SAME inspires students to pursue Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) careers, mentors young professionals, supports veterans, promotes resilience, and helps identify and resolve infrastructure-related challenges; and


WHEREAS, SAME now boasts a leading program of conferences, workshops, symposiums, and professional development and networking opportunities, to include sponsoring the Guam Industry Forum in 2018, which was attended by over five hundred (500) participants in support of the construction of U.S. Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz, named after Marine Brigadier General Vicente "Ben" Blaz, the highest ranking *CHamoru* to have served in the United States Marines; and


