WHEREAS, through their good-faith efforts and coordination, the people of the Republic of China (Taiwan), through their Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the China Medical University Hospital, as well as with the assistance from The National Women's League of the Republic of China, the Taiwanese Business Associates of Guam, Vincent C.H. Yao, Director General of North American Affairs, and His Excellency Wallace M.G. Chow, Ambassador of the Republic of China (Taiwan) in the Republic of Palau, donated two hundred thousand (200,000) surgical masks to the government of Guam for distribution to healthcare workers and other frontline workers responding to the COVID-19 crisis; and

WHEREAS, in communications between Guam patients and Ms. Aichi Chou, Chief Executive Officer of the China Medical University Hospital's International Medical Service Center, discussions on donating Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to the island of Guam began. Their world-class hospital facility, founded in Taiwan in 1980, has provided life-saving medical procedures and services to patients from Guam and was previously awarded a Certificate of Appreciation in 2018 by Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo. The Taiwan hospital also earned a Gold Seal of Approval from the Joint Commission International in 2018, showing their dedication to improving healthcare quality and safety, and it has been recognized as a responsible medical center and fortress of public health in the Asia Pacific region; and

WHEREAS, Vincent C.H. Yao, Director General of North American Affairs, received his Master's and Bachelor's degrees in International Relations from the National Chengchi University in 1994 and 1989, respectively. He was enrolled in the Diplomat Training Programme at Oxford University from September 1994 to July 1995, and in the Senior Executive Fellow Program at Harvard University in 2005; and he began his public service working as a Desk Officer for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Department of North American Affairs, where he served from 1993 to 1997. He then served as Secretary to the Taiwan Minister of Foreign Affairs in 1997, as the Third and Second Secretary of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in the United States from 1997 to 2003, and later as the office's Political Division Deputy Director from 2008 to 2013. He also served as Political Section Chief of the MOFA Department of North American Affairs from 2003 to 2007, Assistant Director-General from 2007 to 2008, Deputy Counselor from 2013 to 2014, and Deputy Director General from 2015 to 2016. Vincent C.H. Yao's most recent roles include serving as Senior Assistant to the Taiwan National Security Council Secretary-General from 2014 to 2015, and as Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Seattle, Washington, from 2016 to 2018. He received the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Outstanding Service Award in 2005 and has served in his current role as Director General of the Department of North American Affairs since December 2018; and

WHEREAS, Ambassador Wallace M.G. Chow received his Master's and Bachelor's degrees in 1994 and 1986, respectively, both in International Relations, at the National Taiwan University. In 2004, Ambassador Chow completed a fellowship at the Foreign Service Programme at Oxford University in the United Kingdom. Ambassador Chow began his public service in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) working as a Desk Officer at the Department of International Organization in 1991. From 1995 to 2001, Ambassador Chow served as the Third and Second Secretary at the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in New York. In 2001, Ambassador Chow served as Secretary at the Deputy Minister's Office; and he then worked as Section Chief of the Department of African Affairs from February 2002 to August 2003. Ambassador Chow served as Secretary of the Department of International Organizations in 2004 before serving a six (6)-year post at the Embassy of the Republic of China (Taiwan) to Kiribati from 2005 to 2011, where he served as First Secretary and then as Senior First Secretary. In 2012, Ambassador Chow served as Senior Executive Officer of the National Security Council; in 2014, he became the Deputy Director General of the Department of International Information Services; and in 2015, he served as the Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Honolulu, Hawaii; and Ambassador Chow continues to serve in his current role as Ambassador of the Republic of China (Taiwan) to the Republic of Palau; and

WHEREAS, with their history of public service and dedication to assisting Taiwan's regional neighbors during the COVID-19 global health crisis, Director General Vincent Yao and Ambassador Wallace Chow made a commitment to facilitating their island's generous donation to Guam and, with help from Ms. Aichi Chou, Hawaii State Office in Taipei Executive Director Alex Lei, and National Women's League of Taiwan Chairwoman C. Joanna Lei, they were committed to the difficult task of receiving approval from the United States for medical aid to properly flow to Guam. Despite the political tension and international restrictions, and with the tireless hard work and dedicated efforts of Director General Vincent Yao, Ambassador Wallace Chow, and Ms. Aichi Chou, their mission to help Guam was successful; and

WHEREAS, President Anna Kao and former President Lily Yu of the Taiwanese Business Associates of Guam further coordinated the donation of face masks to Guam. WHEREAS, the tremendous assistance and heartfelt donations that the medical community and NGOs of Taiwan have provided to the island of Guam underscores the sincerity and compassion of their island nation and their commitment to our sister-city relationship, as well as their willingness to help protect the people of Guam in the midst of a crisis. The diplomacy displayed in initial discussions led to conversations at the international level and has further helped to develop more meaningful relations between the people of Guam and the people of Taiwan, and will lead to fostering more productive regional partnerships for the benefit of the people of the Asia Pacific region; now therefore, be it
