- 3 WHEREAS, it is customary for I Liheslaturan Guåhan to acknowledge

- 6 WHEREAS, I Liheslatura recognizes the love and generosity Joe Thomas
- 7 Couch gave over many years to the community of golf players and enthusiasts on Guam;

**WHEREAS,** Joe Thomas Couch is from El Dorado, Arkansas and was born in

2 Little Rock, the state capital, and graduated from the University of Arkansas where he

played collegiate golf; and

WHEREAS, Joe Thomas Couch moved to Guam in 1971 to work for the advertising department of J&G Enterprises, and later joined Glimpses of Guam Magazine in 1974 which at the time was published and operated by the U.S. Navy; and WHEREAS, Joe Thomas Couch eventually took ownership of Glimpses of Guam and successfully navigated this critical aspect of Guam's expanding media industry for 31 years until making the decision to sell his company in 2005; and

WHEREAS, Joe Thomas Couch's Glimpses of Guam, Inc. grew to an advertising agency and a local and regional authority in print media, publishing the Guam Business News, Marianas Business Journal, Marine Drive magazine, military base guides, and USO magazine; and

WHEREAS, although Joe Thomas Couch was deeply committed to the success of his business, the sport of golf captured his passion as he played competitively throughout the early 1970's and into the late 1980's; and

**WHEREAS,** Joe Thomas Couch was a member of the Guam national men's team which competed in the South Pacific Games and played in the championship and "A" flights for a number of years – and following many competitions over the years, he transitioned to recreational golf with the Hawaiian Golf Club; and

WHEREAS, as a member of the Guam National Golf Federation, Joe Thomas Couch served in different capacities from President to Secretary General, and together with another Guam leader in the sport of golf, the late George Benoit, he was responsible for the development and growth of the sport on the island over the last 40 years; and

WHEREAS, Joe Thomas Couch helped to establish the Guam Junior Golf and the men's and women's amateur golf programs and was instrumental in helping to create a direct relationship between Guam's community of golf players and the Royal & Ancient Golf Club which is more commonly known as the R&A, and its affiliate the Asia Pacific Golf Confederation; Membership in the R&A enabled Guam's top adult and junior players to receive invitations to participate over the years in world-class amateur tournaments and competitions throughout Asia, the Pacific, the United States, and Europe; and

WHEREAS, despite his declining health during the last several years, Joe Thomas Couch always found ways to lend a helping hand to the Guam National Golf Federation, attending every ranking tournament he could participate in, and shuttling players to and from the driving range or working as the tournament starter; and

WHEREAS, fondly remembered by his family, close friends, and community of golf players and enthusiasts for his sense of humor and his lively and optimistic attitude on life, Joe Thomas Couch leaves behind his wife of 31 years and longtime Guam
