Barnes on December 8, 1941, who served on active duty as a Chief Yeoman, USN, as well as Master Sergeant, USAF, and Rosa Eclavea Perez Cruz former teacher at the Guam
 - WHEREAS, Colonel Cruz attended Tumon Junior High School and graduated from John F. Kennedy High School in 1964; and San Francisco State University with a degree in Electrical Engineering. He had a distinguished career as a nuclear test engineer with Admiral Rickover's Naval Nuclear Propulsion Systems Program, and served as Vice President with Enova Engineering Services, a nuclear engineering consulting firm; and served as the Vice President with Radiance Services Company, and worked as a Project Director for ABB Energy Systems; and

1 WHEREAS, he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps in 1965; and served with 2 distinction on active duty in Vietnam as an enlisted artilleryman, and later as a Reserve 3 officer activated to serve during Desert Shield/Desert Storm and again during Operation Enduring Freedom and Iraq Freedom. He also acted as Assistant Chief of Staff 4 (Logistics) for the I Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Pendleton until he retired with 5 6 the rank of Colonel in 2005; and 7 WHEREAS, Allan Cruz has been active in military organizations, and held several leadership roles including: President, Marine Corps Reserve Officers 8 9 Association; President I Marine Division Association, San Francisco Chapter, Commandant, Marine Corps League, Mt. Diablo Detachment; President of Board of 10 11 Trustees, Veterans Memorial Building, Lafayette, and currently lives in Walnut Creek, California with his wife Susan Ford Cruz. His son Nathan Cruz is a Senior Policy 12 Analyst for the Port of San Francisco.
