and education surrounding their ocean environment; and

WHEREAS, the community of Guam has been enriched through their pursuit of

civilian volunteers to play an active role in the preservation of Guam's marine life; and

WHEREAS, the Micronesian Conservation Coalition began sponsoring students

to gain their scuba certification in 2016, encouraging and invigorating scientific pursuits

in our youth; and
